### Ask the Pastor

**Question:** On All Saints Sunday, the tradition has been for deaths of members to be remembered with a rose placed on the altar by a family member. Is that changing?

**Answer:** It is changing in the sense that we are adding to the tradition and making it new.

This is a change I requested. I believe when God called me to be a Pastor to minister to people in need, the people God sent me to care for are not restricted by a set of man-made rules or laws. When God called me to be a Pastor at St. Paul's on the Hill, I was not called to only care for those people in need who are designated as members of St. Paul's but also to care for all people who enter our church doors and the community around our wonderful congregation.

In past years we have restricted our memorial service on All Saints Sunday of placing a rose on the altar in remembrance of congregation members who have died during the past year. It is a wonderful tradition that I appreciate and I know is appreciated by the family and friends of those who have died. But I see members of our congregation who have been unable to memorialize the loss of loved family because they were not 'registered' members of St. Paul's. This hurts my heart and grieves my soul. Some of our members have spouses and children who are not 'registered' members of our congregation. I cannot imagine a member of our church not placing a rose on the altar in remembrance of a husband, wife or child because they are not on our membership roll. I also find it sad that parents of our members are not honored in the same way.

Therefore, on November 11, 2019 during the Church Council meeting, a continuing resolution was approved to include member's spouses, children and parents to be memorialized with the placing of a flower on the altar during All Saint's Sunday. The continuing resolution adopted by the Church Council reads:

CR- 2019-1

Be it resolved that the Church Council of St. Paul's Lutheran Church, Lohman, approved including non-members of the immediate family members of the church to include parents, spouses and children to be recognized on All Saints Sunday. Those non-members will be honored in the same way as members who have passed which may include placing a flower on the altar and/or by any means determined by the presiding Pastor.

### Congregational Council Meeting, November 11, 2019

A regular Congregational Council meeting was called to order at 6:35pm, on Monday, November 11, 2019 by Council president Zola Finch. Present were council members Laurie Koestner, Delores Vlach, Kathy Meller, Dan Tschirgi and Becky Weber. Absent were Paula Linsenbardt and Mitch Plochberger. Also present were Council Treasurer Kay Pascoe and Pastor David Viles.

The meeting was opened with a prayer by Pastor Viles, followed by a devotion from: John 10:11-15, "I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for his sheep. He who

is a hired hand and not a shepherd, who does not own the sheep, sees the wolf coming and leaves the sheep and flees, and the wolf snatches them and scatters them. He flees because he is a hired hand and cares nothing for the sheep. I am the good shepherd. I know my own and my own know me. Just as the Father knows me and I know the Father; and I lay down my life for the sheep."

Pastor David shared that he is our shepherd and would lay down his life for each of us members here at St. Paul's. Pastor shared that Jesus includes everyone, and he to, as our pastor, cares for each one of us. He added that he also cares for people who are not our church members, those who do not belong to our sheep pen. Pastor calls for each one of us, as church council and congregation members, to care for all people, both inside and outside of our sheep pen.

President Finch called for a motion to approve the minutes of the October 2019 Council Meeting. Two changes to the October 2019 minutes were offered by Delores Vlach and accepted by the council members. These changes will be made to the October 2019 minutes and a copy of these changes will be posted in the church Narthex. The motion to approve the revised October 2019 minutes was offered by Dan Tschirgi, seconded by Kathy Meller, and passed via voice vote.

The President called upon Council Treasurer Kay Pascoe, to present a review of the past month's expenses and incomes. A two-page review was presented and accepted. A motion to approve the past month's expenses was made by Laurie Koestner, seconded by Kathy Meller, and passed via voice vote.

President Finch then asked Pastor Viles for the October 2019 mileage and activity report. Pastor's October mileage totaled 156 miles. A motion to approve the mileage was made by Kathy Meller, seconded by Dan Tschirgi, and passed via voice vote. The amount is \$90.28.

Pastor reported attendance at several meetings, to include Lions Club, Food Bank at Trinity in Russellville, Church Council, Weekly Adult Forums, Weekly Confirmation Classes, Weekly Bible Study Classes, Ministerial Alliance, Junior Lutherans at Wasserlauf, STARS presentation, St. Paul's Fall workday, Bishops Convocation at the Lake, and three days of working with Lifetouch to take photos. He also spent several hours of photo-shopping the twenty-two submitted photos, and uploading these photos to Lifetouch. He created the October Epistle, emailed it and it was also sent via postal mail. He set up the basement for Trick or Treat and attended in place of Trunk or Treat. Pastor conducted one wedding rehearsal, and performed one wedding. Pastor performed two communion and two noncommunion services, and one funeral. He made four hospital visits, one nursing home visit and one family visit.

President Finch then called for the Standing Committee Reports which are included below.

President Finch then called for discussion of Old Business.

Old Business: President Finch the new co-chairs for the Safety and Security Advisory Council will be setting up a standing meeting time shortly.

Pastor David reports Lifetouch loved our congregation, and we had a decent turnout for our directory. We are thankful to Pastor David for the many hours he worked on photo shopping and submitting photos to Lifetouch for people who were unable to come to church for their pictures. We also appreciate the hours Laurie attended as the hostess to get people registered and Jana Thompson filling in during Laurie's absence part of one day.

New Business: President Finch reports she received a letter from Cole R1 High School regarding contributions for Project Graduation. After some discussion, council decided we will ask for contributions via a free will offering in the Narthex following church services after the first of the year.

Regarding All Saints Sunday recognition of deaths during the year, Pastor David proposed that we include non-members who are the immediate family members of church members to include; parents, spouses and children, to be in recognition of All Saints Sunday. These non-members will be honored in the same way as member deaths with a flower placed on the.

After discussion President Finch called for a Continuing Resolution to include aforementioned immediate family non-members of church members to be included in recognition of All Saints Sunday. A motion was offered by Laurie Koestner, seconded by Kathy Meller and passed via voice vote. The Annual Meeting will be January 26, 2020. A reminder was made that reports are due by December 15, 2019 for the Annual Report.

A motion to adjourn was made by Laurie Koestner, and seconded by Dan Tschirgi. Council was adjourned at 8:10 pm. The Lord's Prayer was recited by all.

Thanks again to Ashley Meyer for designing the bulletins for us. Thanks to Pastor David for sending a message and prayer with us



# **Reading Through the Bible**

### Some of what we have learned the past 4 weeks.

We finished the Old Testament on November 2<sup>nd</sup> and shouted halleluiahs and amens. Although it can be a difficult reading it is well worth knowing the background as we read the New Testament.

In celebration of this great task, Pastor David provided a cake to mark the occasion and everyone enjoyed.





Matthew, Mark and Luke have given us three similar but slightly different views of Jesus life and teachings. Matthew was speaking to the Jews and used old

testament scriptures to point to the coming Messiah and how Jesus was fulfilling those scriptures that proved he was the long awaited savior.

Mark was writing to the Gentiles and probably more specifically the Romans. Luke was not one of the

original apostles but instead a physician who was meticulous in gathering information from witnesses who were around Jesus. He has a lot more details concerning the birth and death of Jesus and his medical abilities show through on his descriptions.

Matthew details the genealogy of Jesus to show he descended from Abraham, the father of the Jews to show the connection to God's chosen people. Luke on the other hand details the genealogy of Jesus back to God, to show the connection of being the Son of God and therefore God himself.

All three gospel writers document many of the well-known miracles and teachings but they also have unique stories and descriptions not found in the other writer's gospels.
