With these expensive days and the dry times we have had in August and September we also know that God has blessed most of us abundantly in spite of the hard times.


Here on the Church Hill and most of the area we have deep wells that provide all the water we need to drink, bathe and

Ask the Pastor

Question: *There are numerous bible passages that I find disturbing.*

For instance, Philippians 4:6 "Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God."

"Do not worry about anything." Really? Who can do that? It sounds good, but who can do that?

There is not a person in the world that does not worry about something. It may be something tiny or something huge. So the first part of the answer is no, there is no one who is able to be completely free of worry.

I think a good place to start this discussion is to consider when we first began to worry. When we are born and for the first few months of our lives, we have no worries. If the baby is hungry, we find out from hearing it cry. We give it some food and it stops crying. If the baby has a dirty diaper, it cries and we discover it is wet or worse and we change the diaper. The same goes if it does not feel well or has a different concern. The baby does not have any worries, it makes a sound and it is answered with all of its needs being met. The baby is completely taken care of without any worries.

Somewhere around a year old we start making demands of the baby. "Say mama, say dada. "Eat your baby food, drink from the sippy cup." "Use the potty chair, don't mess in your diaper!" All of a sudden the child is being deluged with commands it must obey. If it does not obey there are repercussions; a harsh word, timeout in the corner, sent to bed without supper, the loss of that loving feeling.

The satisfied baby has learned to worry about those repercussions if it does not perform as expected. So it starts on its journey in an unforgiving world with demands, expectations, and repercussions.

This is the nature of humanity as it is learned from the ways of the world. This is the life of a slave given the demands of a taskmaster of oppression and the worry of not meeting them.

We have learned what the world demands of us and we have become a part of the world's way. The world tempts us with riches, power, and all things desirable. If someone has more than us, or something better, we worry about how we will compare and how we can compete.

This type of life is not what God intended for his beloved creation. God created humans and put them in a garden that contained all they needed. Everything was provided by God, and there were no worries to consider. They ate all they wanted from the vegetation God made for them. They were rich in God's love, a carefree life of eating, sleeping and tending to the garden that was given to them.

They were like newborn babies, but they never had to cry for anything because it was already there, free for the taking. There were no real demands or expectations except to stay away from one single tree in the middle of the garden.

This is the life God intended for us to live. One where his beloved humans were completely happy and content. A life filled with all that was needed. There was no competition for more, no envy or desire for extra or better. It was perfect, and worry free.

So the other part of the answer is yes, it is possible to a degree not to worry. If we live as God intended, then we would be happy and content with having all that we need. That would be plenty of food to keep us healthy, clothes to keep us warm and protected, a home to shelter us from the weather, and the ability to gain these things through honest work.

The final piece of the answer is found in the next verse, 7: "And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus."

If we strive to live as intended from the beginning, we will not allow the world to dictate our desires with unneeded temptations. We will be content with what we have and let only our needs be the requests we make known to God through prayer and supplication. We will have peace without worry.

Church Hill Drive Newly Paved

Pastor David and the City Council of Lohman have been working hard for two years to get Church Hill Drive repaired and repaved. On September 22, 2021 this was finally accomplished. The concrete culvert was repaired on the north side, and a curb added for the safety of drivers on that side of the road. The ends of the road were trenched and reworked and then paved with about two inches of fresh asphalt by Higgins Asphalt company. The total cost of this project was about \$23,000.00 and was paid for by the 1/2 cent county sales tax and the City of Lohman Street Fund. St. Paul's church was not responsible for any of the costs associated with this paving project.

A Congregational Council meeting was called to order by Pastor David Viles at 6:06pm on Monday, September 13, 2021 in the youth education room. Present were council members Kathy Meller, Mitch Plochberger, Jana Thompson, Delores Vlach, and Becky Weber. Absent were President Zola Finch, Paula Linsenhardt, Laurie Koestner and Dan Tschirgi. Also present were Pastor David Viles and Council Treasurer Kay Pascoe.

Pastor David opened the meeting a devotion on based on Nahum 1:7, "The Lord is good, a refuge in times of trouble."

Once in a while I just don't know how I am going to get through the day. I know I'm not alone in this feeling. I know that each of you have days like that when you feel a little overwhelmed by what is happening and the expectations to follow. The best advice is to put it all in God's hands and let it go. Let God take care of all the troubles for us so we can rest. That is great advice and it does help to take

a breather and hang up our worries for a time. The next best advice I've heard is to only concentrate on the moment. Just put one foot in front of the other and take it a step at a time. I find these two pieces of advice actually work well together. When I put it all in God's hands I'm rewarded with some peace of mind and I'm reassured that through God my problems will be resolved. As I put one foot in front of the other, and focus on the present, I'm able to start at a beginning. It is in that beginning that God comes to me, and to all of us when we allow it, and the Holy Spirit directs our mind. God puts our feet on the correct path, and little by little, one step at a time, he guides us through our times of trouble. God truly is our refuge and God truly is good. Pastor then said a prayer.

Pastor David called for approval of the previous council meeting minutes. A motion to approve the August 8, 2021 council meeting minutes was offered by Jana Thompson, seconded by Kathy Meller and passed via voice vote.

Pastor David called on Council Treasurer Kay Pascoe to give the treasurers report, and copies of said report were distributed to council members.

Pastor David reports there was no mileage for August, 2021. Pastor David reported the following activities for August 2021: Worship and Music meeting via email, Lohman City Council meeting, and Church Council. Pastor performed one office counseling visit, one phone counseling, multiple phone conversations, prayers, and visits at the office and parsonage. Pastor held four services for August, two communion Sunday worship services in person and online with Facebook Live, and two non-communion services in person and online with Facebook Live. Pastor prepared one non-communion service in advance and conducted by Dan Tschirgi. Pastor prepared, printed and emailed worship bulletins, updated website with bulletin and video services, posted a daily photo with Bible verse and message on Church Facebook, and created, printed and emailed the September Epistle. He created a list of hymn choices for Worship and Music, and covered for emergencies at Trinity Lutheran Church in Russellville while Pastor Ed was on vacation. Pastor took four days of vacation for his mother-in-law's funeral service in Arkansas.

Pastor David then called for the committee reports.

Evangelism: Delores Vlach offered a big thank you to Misty Schroeder and Donita Stubinger for providing sausage, biscuits and gravy, fruit and drinks for our September fellowship hour. She reports the plans are complete for Church Family Day set for September 19 2021. The committee decided it would be good to have family day with covid precautions, for St. Paul's family and friends. Delores reports there are a few changes in the games, which will all be played outside except for bingo, adding the games will be played directly following the Open House, with the meal, catered by Misty Schroeder and Donita Stubinger, and served by the committee members at 11:30am. Delores wishes to thank all who are helping with this event. Delores also wishes to thank Frank and Kay Pascoe for providing Thrivent cards that will help with the expense of the catered meal.

Technology: Dan Tschirgi, absent. Pastor David reports there is still a need for more technology volunteers to assist with Sunday Worship video services. Pastor offers that this is very easy to do, and interested people may "come and see" how it is done before committing to assist.

Worship and Music: Kathy Meller reports the October Hymns were selected via emails among the Worship and Music committee members. She reports we will continue to offer the communion packets for those who wish to partake in Holy Communion in this manner. She reports she has had several people offered compliments with Setting 10 beginning in September.

Parish Education: Laurie Koestner absent. Pastor David offered Laurie's written report in her absence. Sunday School begins September 19, 2021 with an Open House to be held just after worship service, with a tour of the Sunday School wing for people to get a glimpse of what is up and coming. Laurie has ordered promotional materials from Samaritan's Purse Operation Christmas Child (Christmas Shoeboxes).

Church Improvement: Mitch Plochberger reports fall work day is set for October 9, 2021 at 8:00am, with tree trimming and cutting on the schedule list, and other work activities.

Stewardship and Finance: Paula Linsenbardt. No report.

Mutual Ministry: Jana Thompson reports they plan to meet September 15, 2021 with plans to discuss Staff Evaluations, and Time and Talent sheets.

Old Business: Pastor David reported the Blessing Box is installed, with plans to put a sign at the bottom of the church hill to inform people of its location. He also reports church council will discuss at the next meeting possible uses for the Church Box donated by the Cameron Freiner family.

New Business: Pastor David reports council members are tasked with deciding what to do with the October Missions offering. Becky Weber suggested we consider donating to Pre-Born. Becky reported this group offers free ultrasounds, counseling, prayers and support to pregnant women. Becky reported statistics provided by Pre-Born show that eighty percent of women who go to pregnancy clinics with the intention to have an abortion, choose to carry their babies to term after seeing their baby on an ultrasound. After discussion, a motion made by Mitch Plochberger to give 50% to Pre-Born and 50% to Disaster Relief. Jana Thompson seconded this motion, and was passed via voice vote.

Pastor David called for a motion to adjourn. A motion to adjourn was made by Mitch Plochberger, seconded by Delores Vlach, and was passed via voice vote. Meeting adjourned at 7:00 pm. Pastor closed the meeting with The Lord's Prayer.




It's a Girl..! And she is beautiful.

Congratulations also to great grandmother Jean Fink who has been floating on a cloud with joy.


Pastor looks forward to baptizing little Kinlee when things settle down and we have an opportunity.
