Congregational Council Meeting, February 14, 2022 Respectfully submitted by Frank Pascoe

† At 6:05 pm on February 14th a regular meeting of the church Council of St. Paul's Evangelical Lutheran Church was called to order by the Council President Zola Finch. Present were council members Delores Vlach, Kathy Meller, Mitch Plochberger, Laurie Koestner, Frank Pascoe, Jana Thompson, and Stacy Bubach. Absent was member Dan Tschirgi. Also present were Pastor David Viles and Church Treasurer Kay Pascoe. The previous minutes were not requested.

† Pastor Viles opened the meeting with a prayer. President Finch called upon Church Treasurer Kay Pascoe to present a financial report. She shared financial statements dated Jan. 31, 2022. These were reviewed by Council members. Questions were answered and resolved.

+ President Finch then called upon Pastor David Viles to present his regular monthly report of activities to the Council. Pastor's report detailed 42 miles of automobile travel for which Pastor will be reimbursed \$23.52, as the Council approved Mitch Plochberger's motion, which was seconded and approved via voice vote. Pastor's report went on to detail his attendance at eight meetings and five personal or phone visits. A number of other activities were reported among them his covering for Pastor Ed Merckel of Trinity Russellville from Jan. 5th thru Jan. 21st, while Pastor Ed was on vacation. Pastor David officiated at five January services at St. Paul's, and one hospital communion service.

+ Council President Finch called upon guest parishioner Becky Weber who had requested the Council hear her suggestion for beginning at St. Paul's a Pro-Life group within our congregation. Becky presented several ideas and concerns in order to bring Pro-Life sentiments and actions to our church body. She spoke of her personal concern and commitment to protecting the life of the yet-to-be-born. She envisioned our actions at St. Paul's to be "not a march against abortion" but rather a "march for Life'. Becky asked that our congregation focus on the sanctity of life and attempt to do more in practical care and support of women in need who find themselves in a crisis pregnancy. She indicated that a practical effort might involve a mission project like the one done at Trinity Russellville, that is to collect funds for a group known as the "Pregnancy Help Center of Jefferson City". This local group offers free testing and licensed consultation for those facing unplanned pregnancy. Becky suggested that this might be an option for one or more special offerings during the Lenten season. She also enumerated several other local groups which we might support in some fashion in the future, among them VITAE, Birthright, or Lutheran Children & Family Services of Columbia, Mo.

† Becky's comments and suggestions were discussed by the Council members. It was suggested by some members that we might also focus on supplying baby and infant items to these organization to aid in their general efforts. {note: a copy of Becky's full presentation will be available in printed form upon request.}

President Finch called upon the various Committee Chairpersons to present their monthly reports:

Evangelism: Delores Vlach expressed thanks to Glen & Donita Stubinger for the excellent pastries and fruit served on February Fellowship Sunday. What a treat!

Delores noted that the new member reception will be postponed until March 6th. This will be held on a Fellowship Sunday and may include new members-to-be Helen Girard, Angie Stubinger, Mark Schroeder, Ruth Stubinger, and Hope Stubinger. **NOTE:** *In the days after the Council meeting nine others requested membership and were approved by Council. They are Melissa Thompson, Shawn Hillen, Ashleigh Creel, Leland Stuart, Stacy Steele, Brooke Steele, Emma Steele, Andrew "Drew" Steele, and Harley Enowski.*

Delores requested the Church make a renewed effort to have persons sign up for the Fellowship Hours after Sunday services. There are at least six open spots yet to fill, and persons are encouraged to sign up for these special events. She asked that the Fellowship events be noted in each Epistle that goes out. Delores also requested input as her committee prepares for the annual Pancake Breakfast. Her committee will be discussing the date, what to serve, and how to plan, as it has been suggested that dine- in and take-out be offered. This was much discussed by the Council members. Delores's committee will decide at their upcoming meeting.

Technology: President Finch mentioned the need for one additional sound board volunteer.

Worship & Music: Chairperson Kathy Meller reported on the activities discussed at their Feb. 8th meeting. A suggestion was made that some more contemporary music be played during the prelude. This was done on Feb. 13th. Comments were positive. Variations will follow in the future. The volume of the song leader's microphone was discussed. Getting the handheld microphone set at the optimum level for all song leaders is a work in progress which will be undertaken soon. All hymns have been chosen for the Lenten season. Some special music during Lent, Palm Sunday, and Easter Sunday will be arranged with a choir. Setting Three has been chosen. A hymn of the month may begin this fall. There will be Mid-Lenten services held in the main sanctuary. There will be no refreshments this year. Holden Evening Prayer will be sung. Expanding the responsibilities of an enlarged Altar Guild was discussed. Erika Gerth will continue to find readers or each Sunday. It was noted that our Bishop, the Rev. Susan Candea, will be at St. Paul's Sunday Service on April 3rd.

Parish Education: Laurie Koestner reported on the ongoing Sunday School efforts. While the attendance is very low, additional teachers would be ideal. She is hopeful that things will return to normal in the future. Laurie is currently using "Ministry-To-Children.com" for materials. This service offers a free curriculum, lessons and ideas for Sunday school programs.

Church Improvement: Mitch Plochberger reported on the work and concerns with the interior lighting and electrical issues. He has had meetings and consultation with Ott Electrical of Jefferson City and their representatives. Mitch also indicated that work on the two front doors and work on the two wooden doors entering the sanctuary are ongoing considerations. He is also in consultation with the Safety & Security Advisory Group regarding needed security cameras.

Stewardship & Finance: Stacy Bubach reported consultation with her committee members regarding the distribution of the Strobel gift. She will discuss the Council's recommendation to disperse 10% to local charities. Stacy also reported the welcome addition of Liz Russell to her committee of four.

Mutual Ministry: Committee Chair Jana Thompson reported ongoing consultation with her members. She thanked Pastor David for his diligence to the newly established Blessing Box in front of the church. She indicated that he has paid much necessary attention to its use and upkeep. Her committee has discussed how better to make the local community and surrounding areas aware of its existence thru local signage and other promotional efforts. New signage will soon be positioned. A new focus on the Box's availability to provide baby and infant items and items for feminine hygiene was discussed by the Council. Jana and Pastor David suggested that including a phone number would allow persons using the Box to request specific items unavailable in the Box itself.

Old Business: Discussion of the Blessing Box was continued.

New Business: The Council discussed a proposal to donate 10% of the \$96,000 Strobel gift to local charities, a suggestion proposed by parishioner Frank Pascoe at the Annual Congregational Meeting of January 16th. With general discussion and agreement offered by the council members, several local charities were suggested. It was agreed that the local Jefferson City Rape & Abuse Crisis Service and the Food Bank for Central & Northeast Missouri of Columbia Mo. would be the two charities to each receive \$5,000. This was proposed upon a motion offered by Frank Pascoe, seconded by Laurie Koestner, and accepted via voice vote.

Also, under new business Pastor David presented a letter from a former parishioner at St. Paul's. This was Shirley Hetherington of Altoona, WI. This former member is a daughter of the Henry Woehrer

family. She enclosed a cheque for \$7,000 as a gift to St. Paul's. Her letter stated this was a gift to the Perpetual Cemetery Fund, or for any other need of the Church. After discussion it was decided upon a motion by Frank Pascoe, seconded by Laurie Koestner, to divide the amount between the Cemetery Fund and the Church Operating fund. This was accepted via voice vote.

The President then called for the adjournment of the meeting at 8:10 PM. The Council meeting adjourned, and Pastor David led the members in the recitation of the Our Father.
