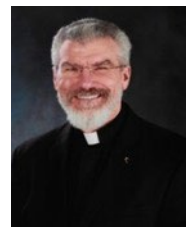

## Ask the Pastor

**Question:** What happened to Psalm 151? Why isn't it in the book of Psalms?

**Answer:** It is and it isn't and there are others missing!

Open your Bible and you will find 150 Psalms listed in the book of Psalm. If you open the Hymn book located in the pews you will also find only 150 Psalms listed. There are Bibles used by the Eastern Orthodox church where Psalm 151 is listed and read, but in the Western church it is rare to see it.

This then is Psalm 151:



1. I was small among my brothers,  
and the youngest in my father's house;  
I tended my father's sheep.
2. My hands made a harp;  
my fingers fashioned a lyre.
3. And who will tell my Lord?  
The Lord Himself; it is He who hears.
4. It was He who sent His messenger  
and took me from my father's sheep,  
and anointed me with His anointing oil.
5. My brothers were handsome and tall,  
but the LORD was not pleased with them.
6. I went out to meet the Philistine,  
and he cursed me by his idols.
7. But I drew his own sword;  
I beheaded him, and took away disgrace from the  
people of Israel.

This Psalm was not considered to be one of the original Psalms from the earliest writings and was therefore omitted from the traditional Bibles.

It was included in the Septuagint (a Greek version of the Hebrew Bible or (Old Testament) and Syriac Bibles (a dialect of Aramaic, common among a number of early Christian communities).

Then in 1947, near Qumran the first of the Dead Sea Scrolls were found in a cave and then many more scrolls were found. These writings were from Jewish texts that were created around the time of Christ.

These scrolls were studied and found to contain not only Psalm 151 but also 152 through 155. The fullness of God's time is given to us in brief snippets. Perhaps knowing too much too soon would overwhelm us and we would not be able to hold that much knowledge.

I have to wonder if this was not the lesson God taught us in the beginning when he told Adam and Eve they were not to touch the tree in the middle of the garden that contained all the knowledge of good and evil.

God will give us the answers in his own time.

"In their hearts humans plan their course, but the Lord establishes their steps." Proverbs 16:9

## **Congregational Council Meeting, June 13, 2022** **Respectfully submitted by Frank Pascoe**

† A six o'clock regular monthly meeting of the Church Council of St. Paul's ELCA of Lohman, Missouri met on June 13th. All Council Members were present: President Zola Finch, Vice President Dan Tschirgi, Secretary Frank Pascoe, and members Stacy Bubach, Laurie Koestner, Kathy Meller, Mitchell Plochberger, Jana Thompson, and Delores Vlach. Also in attendance were Treasurer, Kay Pascoe, and the Pastor David Viles.

† The meeting opened with prayer and a devotion, "The Secret Burden: Guilt" by Pastor Viles. The devotion focused on our being aware that it is often very difficult to forgive ourselves, and our tendency to be hard on ourselves as we make difficult decisions on behalf of our church and congregation.

† Approval of the previous Council minutes of May 9th was done via voice upon a motion offered by Stacy Bubach and seconded by Jana Thompson. Church Treasurer Kay Pascoe presented a four-page "Statement of Financial Position", dated May 31, 2022. She answered questions regarding our current financial stability and progress. Recent donations were highlighted.

† Pastor Viles presented a detailed account of his May activities. His May mileage totaled 88 miles. His reimbursement of \$51.48 was approved upon a motion passed via voice offered by Mitchell Plochberger and seconded by Laurie Koestner. Pastor listed six meetings within and out of our congregation. Seven personal visits were detailed. Numerous other activities were noted: two baptisms, the May "Epistle" created and e-mailed, and worship bulletins prepared for five Sunday services.

### **President Finch called upon the various Committee Chairpersons to present their monthly reports:**

**Evangelism:** Chairperson Delores Vlach offered many thanks to Andy and Nicole Benne, and to Rich and Gina Prosch, for hosting the fellowship reception on May 22d in honor of our recent high school and college graduates. Her committee gave congratulation cards to the five graduates. Delores also thanked David and Karla Strobel, and Cameron and Karey Freiner and family for hosting the June 5th Fellowship Coffee. The cupcakes were delicious. A new member reception for Amberlyn Ferrell was held. Amberlyn was honored with a large decorated cake. The new-member packet was also presented. Delores reported that her committee has begun work planning our July 4th celebration to be held on Sunday, July 3d. The Council briefly discussed the July 3d event. It was noted that the Farmers Bank of Lohman has joined the contributors for the fireworks display. President Finch wondered if we might have a Shaved Ice Stand at the event. WELCA will be involved in these decisions.

**Technology:** Chair Dan Tschirgi reported that he will be away for the July 3d celebration event. Dave Boyce has volunteered to play the music to accompany the outdoor activities. Dan reported that he is still working to dispose the outdated and unneeded sound equipment that remains on hand. A sale or donation of said equipment will eventually be arranged. It was remarked by several Council members that the video presentation of our Sunday services needs some attention to avoid the jerkiness of the presentation. Dan will pursue a remedy for this issue.

**Worship & Music:** Chair Kathy Meller reported on May 3d and June 13th meetings of her committee. In both meetings the question of sound quality for the beginning of the service was addressed. The volume of both the keyboard and Pastor's microphone was discussed. Attempts will be made to moderate the volume of both. Parishioners have still remarked on their pleasure with the variety of prelude music that is being played. Kathy reported that all hymns for July and August have been chosen. Setting number 8 is to be the setting for both months. Patriotic music has been chosen for the upcoming holidays. A Flag Procession will take place on the July 3d Sunday service. Kathy's committee briefly discussed plans for the Advent Dinner and will continue to make plans for that event. Whether participants bringing dishes, or to have it catered, is a future decision.

**Parish Education:** Laurie Koestner reported on the upcoming Vacation Bible School to be hosted at Trinity Lutheran Church in Russellville. A planning meeting will be held on Thursday, June 16th at 6:00 pm in the Trinity Parish Hall. The date for the event is July 10th thru 14th.

**Church Improvement:** Chair Mitch Plochberger discussed several renovation and repair activities which are currently ongoing or upcoming. He reported on a ceiling fan problem in the sanctuary and no current resolution due to the age of the ceiling fan and a lack of available replacement. No window replacement equipment has currently gone forward. At 6:45 Mitchell's invited guest, Matt Bridges, the construction contractor who is to renovate the entire downstairs areas according to the plans developed by Mitchell and his Church Improvement Committee. Mr. Bridges answered numerous questions by Council members. He informed the Council members about the numerous unknown issues in repairing and replacing the various areas of the lower floor due to the age of the original construction, and the unknown quality of the earth and materials beneath. Mr. Bridges will offer the church a "fixed price contract". Electronic connections will be upgraded. Downstairs ceiling tiles will be replaced. The new lighting will be a softer light with LED features. The old kitchen area will be enlarged. The enlarged kitchen will enjoy more benefit from the air-conditioning. The water quality in the older bathrooms will be improved due to removal of the old line emanating from the parsonage. After numerous other comments on the construction plans, Mr. Bridges left at 7:22.

After Mr. Bridges' departure, the Council discussed the appropriate method of informing the Congregation of the construction plans. It was decided to hold a Congregational meeting on Sunday, July 10th after regular service ended. This decision was entered by a motion offered by Stacy Bubach, seconded by Kathy Meller, and passed via voice.

**Stewardship & Finance:** Chair Stacy Bubach reported that the Church Treasurer's detailed job description had been given to her by Church Treasurer Kay Pascoe. The purpose of this written detailed report was to allow for complete financial recording when the Treasurer was unable to perform on a regular basis. This detailed job description will be preserved electronically after retyping by the Church Office Secretary. Another similar report is forthcoming from Financial Recording Secretary, Marie Scheperle.

**Mutual Ministry:** Chair Jana Thompson reported on her committee's recent May 18th meeting. The Blessing Box was again discussed in that meeting, with several suggestions for improving its functions, and making it better known to potential area users. It has been publicized on Facebook, and by distribution of flyers, and will be noted at the upcoming July 3d/4th event. It will also be noted on the Lohman Post Office bulletin board.

**Old Business:** The President noted no Old Business.

**New Business:** It was mentioned after a question was asked of Pastor Viles about his transfer from our Parsonage to his new home across from the Church that his hoped-for date might be toward the end of July, depending upon the speed of current renovation efforts.

The President declared the meeting's adjournment at 8:12.

Pastor Viles led the group in a recitation of the Our Father.

## Giving Thanks for Donations

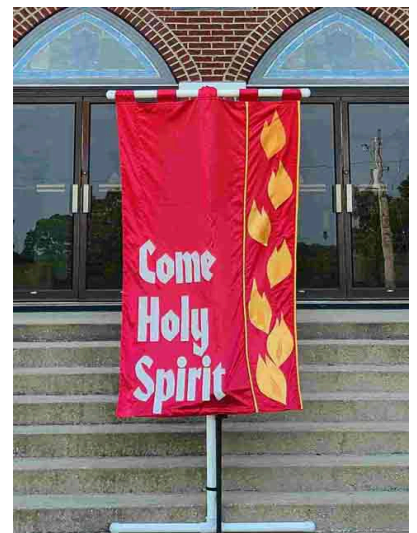

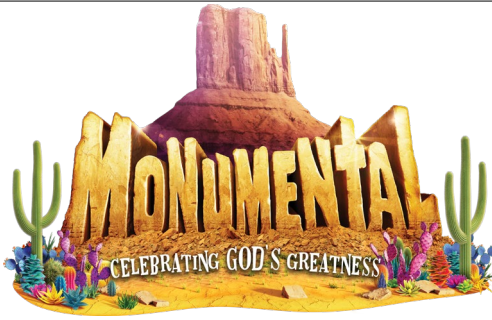
