Congregational Council Meeting, August 8, 2022

† A regular monthly meeting of the Congregational Council of St. Paul's ELCA Church met on August 8th, 2022, at 5:15. Present were members President Zola Finch, Delores Vlach, Stacy Bubach, Laurie Koestner, Jana Thompson, Dan Tschirgi, and Kathy Meller. Also present was Pastor David Viles. Absent were Mitchell Plochberger and Frank Pascoe. Church Treasurer Kay Pascoe was not present.

† The meeting opened with a prayer by Pastor Viles. President Finch called for approval of the previous Council minutes. The motion was made by Jana Thompson with a second by Dan Tschirgi for approval of the minutes. The motion carried.

† Church Treasurer Kay Pascoe had submitted to the meeting electronic three-page summaries of the Church's financial position. She requested the Council vote to move \$25,000 of the Gert/Hugo Strobel Charitable Fund into the fund for basement remodeling, as was pre-approved by the Council. A motion was made by Laurie Koestner and seconded by Jana Thompson to move \$25,000 from the Hugo & Gert Trust for the basement remodel. The motion was approved.

† Pastor Viles submitted a monthly report of his church activities. He had 24 miles of travel and \$15.00 in reimbursable expenses. The Council approved this amount. He detailed 6 specific meetings, 4 visits with individuals, attendance at VBS, a wedding, a Baptism, two Communion Services, three non-communion services, and one wedding. A motion was made by Laurie Koestner and seconded by Stacy Bubach to approve reimbursement of Pastor Viles's mileage for \$15.00. The motion was approved.

For this meeting several of the Council Chairpersons submitted written reports of the previous month's activities, or future work and plans:

Evangelism: Delores Vlach reported her thanks to Kent and Julie Nelson and Gary and Carol Elliott for hosting the August Fellowship coffee. They prepared a complete breakfast, with meats, casseroles, fruits, and drinks. Everything was delicious. The Evangelism Committee held a new member reception for Ryan Linhardt on July 31st following the baptism of his and Lizzie's baby daughter, Daisy Rae. Numerous family members attended. So many parishioners assisted in the preparation of the reception: Trish Russell, Marie Scheperle, and Jerry Koestner. Also assisting were Donita, Glen, Leroy, and Dave. Plans are being made for Family/Friends Day on September 11th. The Committee would like to receive suggestions for activities, games, and any event that would increase our attendance. Please speak to any Evangelism Committee member if you have ideas. The traditional pot-luck lunch will begin at 11:30.

Technology: Adjustments to the overloud sound system will be attempted again. Dan Tschirgi requested to know which specific speakers are coming in too loudly so that efforts will be made to adjust the system so that no one speaker overpowers another. In addition, an attempt will be made to stop the online service on Sunday mornings from freezing. However, this may not be possible until our area has fiber optic cables available.

Worship & Music: Chair Kathy Meller submitted a written report highlighting the August 2d meeting of her committee. The talk continued about the sound system problems as well as the comments of online users about the pausing and freezing of online services. Some parishioners have commented on how cold the Sunday service is when the fans are too high. People seemed very pleased with the patriotic service. Setting eight will be used thru September. Setting three will begin in October. Madeline Stubinger and Morgan Schroeder will receive their first Communion on September 25th. Mattson Stoermer and Mandy Miller will be confirmed on October 30th. Carol Elliott will be Song Leader when Dan Tschirgi or Kathy Meller is unavailable. The Choir may return in October. We concluded that the Advent Dinner will not be possible due to the basement/kitchen remodeling. Blessing of the backpacks will be offered on August 21st. The hymns were chosen for September.

Parish Education: This fall Sunday School will begin in October with a new look. Sunday School will meet once a month on the first Sunday [most months} immediately following the Children's Sermon in the Sunday School wing. The new format called "Children's Church" will meet until church is over. Once attendance numbers improve consideration will be made to return to a Sunday School format again. A couple of members have shared information from Group Publishers for a quarterly curriculum. The committee has researched the curriculum and believes that this shows possibilities for the future when attendance increases and Sunday School/" Children's Church" meets every Sunday. Youth Fellowship will meet a minimum of once a month with a variety of activities throughout the year, beginning on Sept. 11, 2022, with a "Back to School Bash". Youth in grades 6-12 and friends are most welcome to participate. Times will vary based on activities. September 11th we will meet at church in the fellowship hall at 6:30 pm.

Church Improvement: Chairman Mitchell Plochberger had submitted a prior written report. All replacement windows have been ordered. This includes three extra windows upstairs that were found to have leaks. These were in the Sunday School rooms and Pastor's office. The new exterior doors should arrive by the end of August to be installed by Brady's.

Stewardship & Finance: Chair Stacy Bubach reported on her committee's activity on July 21st. Kay Pascoe, Frank Pascoe, Gus Fischer, and Stacy went through the entire contents of the church basement's brown filing cabinet. Outdated and unneeded financial, old insurance records, and irrelevant documents were removed and later destroyed. All records of a personal nature were placed in Pastor's office for safe keeping. Her committee discussed moving the filing cabinet to an upstairs location or getting some different safe/cabinet. The retained documents need to be placed in a fire-proof location or put into electronic document storage.

Mutual Ministry: Pastor was absent from the August meeting. Minor revisions were discussed concerning the Church Handbook, which will be revisited during the September meeting. Annual performance reviews were discussed but no actions were decided. The Church Council President then asked the Council to consider a change in annual performance reviews to be a year long review in real time instead of once a year. After much consideration and discussion it was agreed that performance reviews for paid employees would be on a weekly or as needed basis as warranted. One time annual reviews would no longer be necessary.

Old Business: The President noted no Old Business.

New Business: The President noted no New Business.

After a discussion of the above reports, the Council members went downstairs to work on the renovation of the Church Library. A motion was made by Laurie Koestner and seconded by Dan Tschirgi to adjourn the meeting. The motion carried and the meeting concluded by reciting the Lord's Prayer.

Mobile Food Pantry: Audrey Bunch

The August 9th Mobile Food Pantry was held in the Trinity Lutheran Church parking lot, serving 176 families with 519 people in those families. Some of the items given out were Progresso Soup, Special K snack bars, watermelon, chips, buttery spread, yogurt, ham, soda, milk, sweet potatoes, zucchini, yellow squash and oranges. A big thank you to Carole Merckel for acquiring an abandoned grocery cart for the Mobile Food Pantry from the train station parking lot, and thanks to Terri Zumwalt having her bag of tools to put two new wheels on the cart. Thanks to Dana Frisby for putting up the canopy for the recording volunteer. Volunteers from the Lohman Lions Club were Alberta and Gary Zumwalt, and from St. Paul's were Rosemary Heidbreder, Dan Tschirgi, and Becky Weber. The next Food Pantry will be September 13th at 1:00 P.M.

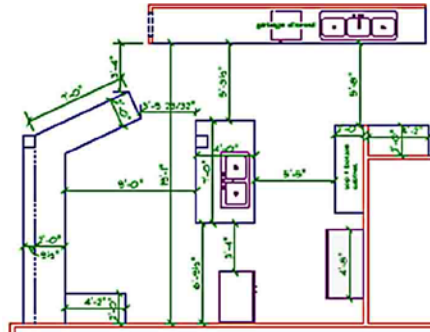
