

# **Pastor's Message**

"Therefore you also must be ready, for the Son of Man is coming at an unexpected hour." Matthew 24:44

"It's beginning to look a lot like Christmas, everywhere you go!" Robert Meredith Willson (1951) This time of year is wonderful and exciting. I see Christmas trees in windows as I drive along the streets. Our Christmas tree sits in front of the north window, perhaps you will see it as you come from Lohman. Max, our youngest pup thinks every brightly colored decoration is his own personal toy. He sits and barks at them wanting to play. Children everywhere are counting down to that special day when they get to open presents on Christmas Eve or morning.

We celebrate Christmas because it commemorates a special time in our history when God was born incarnate. Through the Holy Spirit and a virgin girl named Mary, Jesus the Christ comes to us as fully human, and fully God. Jesus comes to save his most beloved creation who are unable to save themselves. Jesus shows us God's face of love, compassion, healing, and peace for all people regardless of their poverty or riches, social standing, health, or abilities.

As we follow in Jesus' footsteps through the New Testament scriptures we are taught what it is that God would have us do according to his will. We are taught to love everyone as Jesus did, to forgive everyone as Jesus did, to care for everyone as Jesus did. We are taught love, compassion, and peace. Jesus came to us to teach us what the kingdom of God looks like and that as a human it is possible to bring God's kingdom to this world. Even for God in human form it was not easy and for us to be perfect it is impossible. But we can strive to come as close as we can to follow in Jesus' footsteps.

During this time before Christmas we celebrate a similar season called Advent. Just as the people of God waited for the Christ to come thousands of years ago, we now wait for Jesus to come again now. Like our ancestors then, we do not know when he will return. Jesus tells us it will be at an unexpected hour. "About that day and hour no one knows, neither the angels of heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father." Although we do not know when the hour is for Jesus' return, we do know he will come again. He will not come as a humble babe in a manger, wrapped in swaddling cloths. He will come as a mighty force to judge the living and the dead.

The judgement of the righteous who are faithfully waiting, watching, and yearning for his return will be caught up with Jesus to live forever in paradise. (1 Thessalonians 4:16-17) But the wicked

will be destroyed. (2 Thessalonians 1:7-10)

#### Congregational Council Meeting, November 14, 2022 Respectfully submitted by Frank Pascoe

✤ A regular monthly meeting of the Church's Congregational Council was held on Monday evening, November 14th at 6:00 pm. Presiding member Laurie Koestner called the meeting to order. Members present were Stacy Bubach, Jana Thompson, Kathy Meller, Delores Vlach, Frank Pascoe, and Laurie Koestner. Absent were members Zola Finch, Mitch Plochberger, and Dan Tschirgi. Also present was Pastor David Viles.

✤ The meeting opened with a prayer offered by Pastor Viles. Acting President called for approval of the previous Council minutes of October 10th. The minutes were approved upon a motion offered by Jana Thompson, seconded by Stacy Bubach, and agreed to by all present.

✤ The Chair of the Council's Stewardship & Finance Committee, Stacy Bubach, presented to the members the monthly Financial Summary prepared by Church Treasurer, Kay Pascoe. The Council members and Pastor Viles examined in detail the various monthly expenses and balances.

Pastor Viles presented his monthly report of activities. His October mileage totaled 98 miles, including hospital visits and a funeral. Upon a motion offered by Stacy Bubach, seconded by Kathy Meller, his mileage request for \$61.25 was approved via voice vote of all present. Pastor's October meetings totaled nine individual events, including in-house events and community affairs. He conducted six counseling sessions. His other activities included set-up for Bird's Eye View presentation at STARS and the flu shots given on that occasion; attending the Rhymer's Ridge Pumpkin Patch event; Open House at his new home; the Trunk 'n Treat event in St. Paul's parking Lot; preparation of Sunday Bulletins; updating of St. Paul's Website and Video streaming; and the creation of the October Epistle. Pastor conducted two Sunday Communion services and three non-communion services. All services are inperson and online with Facebook Live.

# Laurie Koestner then called upon the various Council Chairpersons present to give a summary of their October activities:

**Evangelism:** Delores Vlach thanked Richard & Rosemary Heidbreder and Gary & Audrey Bunch for hosting the November Fellowship Hour. This event was the last Fellowship coffee for this year due to the basement repair and the cancellation of the Advent Dinner. Delores thanked everyone who hosted the Fellowship Hours during 2022 and emphasized that the time and efforts have been much appreciated by all. Delores commented on the perfect weather for the Halloween "Trunk or Treaters" event held in the St. Paul's parking lot. Over 70 costumed children attended, there were 16 trunks opened, as well as two Fire Trucks on display for a grand time for all attending.

**Worship & Music:** Kathy Meller commented on the wonderful service of Sunday the 6th of November with 110 persons attending the confirmation of Mandy Miller and Mattson Stoermer. She reported that the choir will continue to sing during November and December. The Thanksgiving Eve service will be November 23d at 6:30 pm. The Christmas Eve communion service will be at 6:30 pm on December 24th and there will be no Christmas Day service. The sanctuary will be decorated on Saturday, November 19th by her Committee members. Hymns have been chosen for the December Sundays. She thanked Harry & Jana Thompson for the American flags displayed on Sunday the 14th. A gift of handbells for children has been made to St. Paul's Church. The church organ is scheduled to be tuned soon. Some attention will be directed to increasing the volume of the choir's song when viewing and hearing online.

**Parish Education:** Laurie Koestner reported that five children have been attending the Children's Church event the first Sunday of the month. A total of 42 children and parents attended the Rhymer's Ridge Pumpkin Patch event. The children will participate in a Christmas Ornament making event on Dec. 11th. No Christmas Program is scheduled for this year.

**Church Improvement:** Mitchell Plochberger submitted an e-mailed report for the Council detailing recent Committee activities. Cleaning out the church basement is progressing. Several workers recently moved more items from the basement work areas and removed some of the ceiling tiles. These were taken to the Lohman Community building for eventual reuse. The door installations are complete except for some finish work. Matt Bridges will continue this work. The windows for the upstairs have not yet arrived. Matt Bridges will possibly begin basement demolition later the week of Nov. 14th. Council members present discussed access to bathrooms during the basement remodeling, and how to alert members to any hazardous construction spots was briefly discussed.

**Stewardship & Finance:** Stacy Bubach presented to the Council two proposed budgets for the coming year, one with a 5% increase in selected items and one with a 6% increase in certain items. After discussion by the Council members, the decision was made to approve the 6% increase detailed budget. The motion was made by Laurie Koestner, seconded by Jana Thompson, and passed by voice vote by all present. The 2023 budget will increase compensation for Pastor and other salaried employees.

**Mutual Ministry:** Jana Thompson said her committee has continued to discuss how to continue and to improve the staff evaluation process. The Committee members would greatly appreciate more continuous input from Council members and congregation members on how to evaluate our paid staff, since the once-a-year, sit- down sessions do not allow for a totally satisfactory process. Various suggestions were voiced by the members present. It was suggested that the monthly Epistle and Time & Talent Annual Survey might be employed to expedite the process. Jana's committee will continue to look for ways to deal with this question. There was brief discussion of the question of the use and presence of alcohol on Church property. It was again reiterated that no alcohol should be present within the Church sanctuary, and the sanctuary consisting of the main floor and balcony. Alcohol use anywhere else should always be with Council and pastoral approval.

**Laurie Koestner, presiding member, called for any Old Business:** Utilization of storage in the former Parsonage was briefly addressed. The Council's hope is that storage should be in the basement and not continue in the main rooms; and that storage would continue only through the remodeling of the church basement. The alarm system seems to be working as hoped. There are additional door keys available to members who need them.

**Moving to New Business:** It was noted that the current Council Nominating Committee should be notified to begin contemplation of prospective new Council nominations. Current Committee members are Debbie Boyce, Devin Koestner, Paula Linsenbardt, and Becky Weber.

Pastor Viles reported to the Council that a request to bow-hunt deer on church property has been made to him by a non-church member. After brief discussion by the Council members, the request was declined. Pastor will notify the person of the Council decision.

The Council Meeting was concluded at 8:00 pm. Pastor led the members in a recitation of the Our Father.

## Mobile Food Pantry: Audrey Bunch

The November 8th weather was good to be outside serving at the Mobile Food Pantry. We served 172 families with 486 people in those families. Items served (produce boxes) with apples, carrots, peaches, pomegranates, sweet potatoes, tomatoes, milk and yogurt. Other items; bags of dog food, bags of potatoes, frozen biscuits and frozen assorted chicken. Volunteers from the Lohman Lions Club were Alberta and Gary Zumwalt, and from St. Paul's were Rosemary Heidbreder, Dan Tschirgi, Gary and Audrey Bunch. The next Mobile Food Pantry will be December 13<sup>th</sup> at 1:00 P.M.




Our workload was made much lighter because Les, Kathryn and Marie had previously trimmed the ramp railing outside and set up the tree at the foot of the hill.
