

Pastor's Message

"The tempter came and said to [Jesus], 'If you are the Son of God, command these stones to become loaves of bread." Matthew 4:3



The season of Lent has begun and we started it off with Ash Wednesday. Many were marked with the ashen cross in remembrance of our sinfulness, our need to repent, and God's grace of forgiveness. Last Sunday, February 26th, we heard about the temptations Jesus went through at the hands of Satan, the deceiver.

Every day you are tempted through television, movies, radio, and friends. Most of these are not evil, but they are deceivers in tempting you to think you are all that matters, you deserve all the riches the world has to offer, nothing else matters except you alone. This is how

Satan tried to tempt Jesus. He said Jesus didn't need the God the Father, he could make his own food, he could jump off tall buildings without harm, he could have the whole world for himself. It was all about him and he didn't have to do anything for others, just take care of himself! "God is full of grace and love for you. Through his Son Jesus the Christ you are given the grace of forgiveness and eternal life. The world, can only give you death. The temptation of the world is not so tempting after all."

Ask The Pastor

Question: What is the purpose of the Lenten season of the church?

Answer: "Then Jesus was led up by the Spirit into the wilderness to be tempted by the devil." Matt. 4:1

After Jesus' baptism, he entered the wilderness to prepare for the world and the temptations that would seek to drive him from the path God had set before him. He encountered Satan himself who tempted him to take the easy way out.

such as golfing, going to the movies, fishing, or anything that strongly gives you joy. Each time you feel the urge to have or do that item, ignore it for these forty days. In this way you train yourself to ignore the temptations of the world, and of Satan.

Congregational Council Meeting, February 13, 2023 Respectfully submitted by Frank Pascoe

- **†** A six o'clock PM regular meeting of the Church Council met on Monday, Feb. 13th. The meeting was called to order by Council President Zola Finch. Council members present were Stacy Bubach, Kathy Meller, Delores Vlach, Kent Nelson and Frank Pascoe. Absent were Dan Tschirgi and Jana Thompson. Also present were Church Treasurer, Kay Pascoe and the very Reverend Pastor David Viles.
- † The meeting began with a prayer by Pastor Viles. From his previously e-mailed devotion, Pastor Viles cited 1 Peter 2:21, which reminded the Council members that each had chosen to take up a personal call to serve our Church congregation, leaving our comfort zone to do the work of the Church.
- † The President asked for approval of the previous Council minutes of Jan. 9th. This was done upon a motion by Stacy Bubach, seconded by Kathy Meller, and agreed to by all.
- † The President called on Church Treasurer Kay Pascoe to present a report on the previous month's financial accounting. A four-page statement of the Church's financial position was distributed to all. It showed a year-to-date balance of \$313,466.66 in all accounts. The monthly expense totals thru end of January were \$10,949.97. January income totals were \$12,035.14. The basement remodeling project had an ending balance of \$15,092.22. After a number of questions and discussion, a motion to purchase another 9-month CD from the Farmer's Bank of Lohman for \$20,000 was made by Stacy Bubach, seconded by Kent Nelson, and agreed to by all.
- † Pastor Viles then presented his report of monthly activities. He reported a total of 84 miles of auto travel. His travel total reimbursement was \$55.02, which was agreed to upon a motion by Frank Pascoe, seconded by Delores Vlach, and agreed to by all. His report detailed six meetings, among them Lohman City Council, Lohman Lions Club, Mutual Ministry Committee, and area Ministerial Alliance. His personal pastoral visits included those for spiritual comfort and solace, new membership discussion, and funeral arrangements. His activities included two funerals, preparing Sunday Bulletins, website updating, and Epistle creation and its distribution. There were two Communion Sundays, and three non-communion services, and two funerals conducted.

Pastor reported that the annual Easter Sunday sunrise service will be held at Trinity Church in Russellville. The 2024 service will be here at St. Paul's.

President Finch requested Council Chairpersons to report on their January activities:

Evangelism: Delores Vlach said there are still open monthly Fellowship Coffee hours. The four upcoming months needing sponsors are May, June, August and November. We continue waiting for the basement remodeling project to finalize before planning our long-awaited new member reception. This might be done in May if someone would sign-up. 2023 may be a year in which we do not have our Annual Pancake Breakfast, as this activity depends very much on the kitchen remodeling, and with the breakfast's advertising and pre-planning. The pancake breakfast is just a "wait and see" occasion since the cabinets will need to be in place, the kitchen fully functional, etc.

(NOTE: The Pancake Breakfast is CANCELLED FOR 2023)

Technology: Chairperson Dan Tschirgi was absent from the meeting, attending orchestra rehearsal. There was comment that the online service display was working, only a minor glitch from time-to-time. It was noted that the children's Bell Choir's online presentation was well received.

Worship & Music: Kathy Meller reported on her Committee's Feb. 7th meeting. There was no January meeting. The congregation would like more Christmas carols during the season. This will be planned for next Christmas. The type of wine served at the Eucharist was discussed. The Mogen David type seemed preferred; however, Les Bourgeois "Riverboat Red" was also touted. Setting 10 will be used during Lent. Communion assistants have been chosen for the year. The Choir and Bell Choir will continue occasional performances. Ash Wednesday service will have communion and imposition of

ashes. Mid-week Lenten services will begin March 1st at 6:30 in the sanctuary. This year's theme will honor the 250th anniversary of the hymn "Amazing Grace". Mother's Day [May 14th] will have a special guest, Pastor Kimberly Knowle-Zeller, who will conduct that service.

Parish Education: Since this position on the Council remains unfilled, it was briefly discussed how to present to the Church community our need to have the congregation's input and suggestions on the future of Sunday School and all its potential activities. Will not someone within our Congregation stepup to fill this void? Will we have to hire some qualified person from outside the Church to take on this critical position? President Finch will begin working on a series of questions for the congregation's consideration.

Church Improvement: Chair Kent Nelson reported that the completion date of the basement remodeling project remains clouded. It is now doubtful that it will be completed by the end of February. Kent Nelson reported that prior to this meeting's beginning he, President Finch, Mitch Plochberger, Pastor Viles had a walk-thru with the remodeling contractor Matt Bridges. They attempted to point out various flaws, repair needs, and observations to Mr. Bridges. The group expressed a number of problems, dissatisfactions, and obvious corrections needed prior to completion of the project. A number of Council members made observations of repairs still needed before the project can be called to completion.

Stewardship & Finance: Chairperson Stacy Bubach had no January report.

Mutual Ministry: Chairperson Jana Thompson, unable to attend, had submitted an e-mailed report to all members. She reported on her committee's January 18th meeting. At that meeting, her committee discussed the greeting of visitors, use of church microphones, financial status of the church, distribution of keys, and the critical need for a leader in Parish Education. The consideration of hiring someone part-time to direct this need was discussed. Some of her committee members thought this might be a solution, others had reservations. Her committee noted that only 28 completed "Time & Talent" sheets were returned. Her committee now has two new members, Becky Weber and Devin Koestner.

Old Business: Pastor Viles reported on the ongoing misuse of the Blessing Box by a few who come up to the Church and removed all the contents, but especially all the toilet paper, toothbrushes, toothpaste, etc. The Council briefly discussed what might be done to stop this improper ill-use. Stacy Bubach suggested in the near future we put only food items in the box. Those who are hungry will, it is hoped, be fed, and those who only take the other contents will cease this activity. This suggestion was approved by those who expressed an opinion.

New Business: Hearing none, the President called the meeting to adjournment. The meeting ended upon recitation of the OUR FATHER.

Mobile Food Pantry: Audrey Bunch

Mobile Food Truck came to Russellville at the Trinity Lutheran Church parking lot on February 14th a cool rainy day. The wind gusts and heavy rain wasn't the weather we had hoped for to serve 137 families with 372 people in those families. St. Paul's Congregation donated several boxes of soup, and St. Paul's WELCA donated 100 assorted boxes of cereal that was given out at the mobile. Items from the truck were produce boxes: lettuce, pineapple, green peppers, celery, chives, potatoes, tomatoes, cream cheese, boxes of hot cocoa, cheese puffs, sour cream, frozen brussel sprouts with carrots, and Marie Calendar meals. Thanks to all the volunteers that came out to help. Volunteers from the Lohman Lions Club were Gary and Alberta Zumwalt, from St. Paul's was Dan Tschirgi, Gary and Audrey Bunch. Next Mobile Food Pantry will be March 14th at 1:00 P.M.


2023 Synod Assembly
