Pastor's Message

"Love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your strength. Take to heart these words that I give you today. Repeat them to your children. Talk about them when you're at home or away, when you lie down or get up. Write them down, and tie them around your wrist, and wear them as headbands as a reminder. Write them on the doorframes of your houses and on your gates." Deuteronomy 6:5-9

The month of September brings about a lot of emotions for children, parents, and grandparents. It also brings out a lot of emotions for teachers, principals, bus drivers, cafeteria workers and custodians. Those emotions can run the gamut from the joy of teenagers being out of the house to tears of loss for the baby's first day of school. Teachers will be rushed and beleaguered preparing their sylabus and daily lessons to hand out and to spend their evenings correcting and grading. Teachers will have tears of anguish for the teenagers returning to class, and the joy of seeing new students eager to learn new things.

Regardless of the emotional impact, the most important objective is for the students to learn, and relearn so they will be prepared for the struggles of making their way in the world. As adults know, it isn't easy working, paying bills, dealing with bosses, and the constant worries and struggles the world places on us and eventually our children.

The verses from Deuteronomy above come from Moses who had just received the 10 Commandments on Mt. Sinai. Moses told them to the Hebrews who had left Egypt and were in the wilderness headed for the promised land.

God gave the teachings necessary for the people to survive a world that was filled with opposition and dangers. Without God's help they would not make it, and God helped them to follow a correct path with him so they would be safe.

Moses said, "You must follow exactly the path that the Lord your God has commanded you, so that you may live, and that it may go well with you, and that you may live long in the land that you are to possess."

These days our children must learn the skills necessary in school to survive in the world. They must also learn the word of God that he has commanded, so they may live, and it will go well with them, and they will live long in this land. It is up to you, and me, to teach them. Bring them to church and Sunday school.

Congregational Council Meeting, August 14, 2023

- † The regular meeting of St. Paul's Church Council was called to order by President Zola Finch at 6 p.m. Present were Council members Kent Nelson, Delores Vlach, Dan Tschirgi, Kathy Meller, Stacy Bubach, Jana Thompson, and Frank Pascoe. Pastor David Viles was also present and began the meeting with a prayer and a devotion based on Psalm 145: 15-16.
- † The President requested approval of the previous month's Council minutes. A motion to do this was offered by Kent Nelson, seconded by Dan Tschirgi. Before the vote, Council secretary Frank Pascoe announced to the Council an error in the previous month's minutes. The error, "The Insurance policy premium is increased by 4% each year", should be eliminated before the approval of the minutes. The corrected minutes were then approved by all.
- † The church treasurer, Kay Pascoe, had prepared a summarized financial handout detailing July's balance in all accounts. The summary showed a total income for the month of \$16,252.17, which included a gift of \$750 to the Les Linsenbardt Memorial and Carpet Fund. Income also included \$500 for Parsonage offering and \$155.24 for reimbursed Parsonage utilities. The total of all accounts as of July 31 is \$305,110.02. The treasurer's report was approved upon a motion offered by Kent Nelson and seconded by Kathy Meller and approved by all.
- † Pastor Viles presented his detailed monthly report to the Council. He requested no mileage reimbursement for July 1 − July 31. His report listed six meetings, including Worship and Music, Lion's Club, Lohman City Council, STARS, and Mutual Ministry. He had over eight visits and consultations with parishioners. His report showed two funerals, VBS, a baptism, the preparation of worship bulletins, and the preparation of the August Epistle. Pastor officiated at three communion services during July, in addition to three non-communion Sunday worship services.

President Finch then requested the various Council chairpersons to present their monthly reports:

Evangelism: Delores Vlach announced that "Family Day/Community Day" will be held on Sunday, September 10, following the worship service. Planning for this event will be held after worship on August 20. She would like some volunteers, if possible, to assist in the planning. It will be similar to the 2022 event, a potluck dinner, with games and activities before and after the meal. Delores thanked her fellow Council members for hosting the August 6 Fellowship hour, where a wonderful bounty of food was offered to all by the Council members. A special thanks was expressed to Donita Stubinger for the coffee and for her muffins.

Technology: Dan Tschirgi led the Council members in a discussion and evaluation of the new WisperNet Internet service. The various interruptions in service, caused by the frequent local storms in July and early August, were discussed. The recovery time to continue Internet service was discussed.

Worship & Music: Kathy Meller reported no committee meeting in July. Good reports of the July 2 community celebration were expressed by many. The flag displays and the decorations of the pews, done by Delores Vlach, were highly praised. The childrens' participation with the handbells was a delight. There was brief discussion of the future of the two ancient plaster angels currently in storage. Thanks were expressed to Cynthia Loesch for her interest in the restoration and display of these historic items. It is hoped they can be displayed by this coming October.

Parish Education: The reports on the Sunday School sessions and their attendance was positive. Our thanks to the teachers and parents were expressed.

Church Improvement: Kent Nelson reported activity regarding interest and planning for the church carpet restoration. Two bids have been received, and we are awaiting the third. The totals for each bid are somewhat variable, depending on how the church will participate in removal of the pews and other impediments to the installation. There was discussion of the sub-floor surfaces (some vinyl, some hardwood) and options for floorcovering. It is anticipated that a congregational approval meeting will be held after the final bids are received. We anticipate a written contract. The final color choice of the carpet is yet to be made. There followed discussion of the kitchen appliances – the sink and countertops- were entertained. The purchase of a new 8-burner stove with automatic pilot lighting is to be made soon. No Fall WorkDay date has been decided upon. Discussion of the church grounds and the need for weeding and spraying followed.

Stewardship & Finance: Stacy Bubach had no formal report. After discussion, Kent Nelson offered a motion to increase the church's insurance coverage for contents of the church building from \$300,000 to \$500,000 with an added cost of \$701.00 annually. The motion, seconded by Dan Tschirgi, was approved unanimously.

Mutual Ministry: Jana Thompson reported that her committee met on July 19, with five members present. Pleasure was expressed for the July 4th celebration (held on July 2). All were pleased especially with the large turnout. Continued satisfaction with the new internet service was expressed by those attending the meeting. Thanks were offered to those who helped at Vacation Bible School at Trinity Lutheran Church in Russellville. Members discussed the need for paper offering envelopes versus electronic offering. Paper envelopes will continue through 2023-2024 before a final decision is made. The group discussed and offered opinions regarding the kitchen refurbishment. The carpet installation was discussed. If and how we might celebrate our nation's founding on July 4th, 2026, was briefly discussed. This will be the 250th anniversary of the 1776 Declaration of Independence.

Old Business: The setting up and operation of a new VENMO for electronic offerings is planned. The address is to be: stpaulsvenmo@gmail.com. When and how it will be set up is still under discussion. It was suggested that Debbie Raithel, church secretary, will receive the notices of the offerings and will periodically report the amounts to the church treasurer. A cell phone set-up is needed and may be done via a Google number, which will link to the church's bank account. Finalization of this process is yet to come.

New Business: None

Stacy Bubach displayed large, attractive Mental Health Hotline posters, and asked if parishioners are interested in utilizing the posters, to contact her. Stacy also asked about the current status of our Blessing Box. Pastor reported that its use is dormant, due to the misuse by certain individuals in the community who have taken all its contents on frequent occasions.

The President declared the meeting adjourned upon a motion made by Stacy Bubach, seconded by Delores Vlach, and approved by all.
