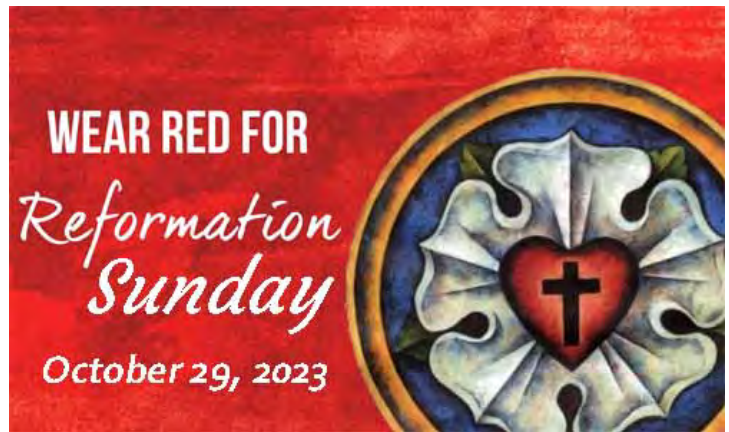

"But the Helper, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, he will teach you all things and bring to your remembrance all that I have said to you." John 14:26



Why do we wear red for Reformation Sunday?

Red is the color that represents the Holy Spirit. We begin wearing red on Pentecost Sunday when we hear of the Holy Spirit coming to the disciples as they are gathered in a room. The Holy Spirit touches each of them like a flame of fire.

On Reformation Sunday, we remember Martin Luther beginning the reformation of the church when he nailed the 95 Theses to the church door in 1517. This was a bold move to call out the Pope and the Church. It could have cost Martin Luther his life, he was excommunicated by Pope Leo X in 1520.

There was a long struggle during this time and many were killed with their red blood flowing in the streets. Martin Luther was convicted by the Holy Spirit to proclaim God as the source of forgiveness.

In the Reformation we see God's presence and activity in the world around us, and we can be transformed by the Holy Spirit when we listen for his word. The Church continues to be reformed and made new through people just like you who open their ears and hearts to God's voice through the Holy Spirit.

On Sunday, October 29, 2023 the Altar in St. Paul's church on the hill will be adorned in red. The lectern and pulpit will be adorned in red. I, your Pastor will be adorned in red. You are invited to wear red on this day to show your response for all who have worked through the Holy Spirit, including yourself, to give God the glory and honor for everyone he calls to do his will in the world.

Congregational Council Meeting, September 11, 2023

† A six o'clock PM regular meeting of St. Paul's Church Council met on Monday, September 11. The meeting was called to order by Council President Zola Finch. Council members present were Delores Vlach, Kathy Meller, Frank Pascoe and Zola Finch. Also present were Pastor David Viles and Church Treasurer Kay Pascoe. Absent were Council members Jana Thompson, Dan Tschirgi, Kent Nelson, and Stacy Bubach, who have electronically confirmed agreement with the Council's motions.

† The meeting began with a prayer led by Pastor Viles. The minutes of the previous meeting of August 14th were approved upon a motion offered by Kathy Meller, seconded by Delores Vlach and approved via voice vote. The President requested Church Treasurer Kay Pascoe to present her detailed summary of the Church's "Statement of Financial Position", dated August 31st, 2023. This four-page summary was distributed to all present. Questions were asked and answered regarding the Church's assets, cash and investments, and fund balances. It was noted the very sound state of the Church's financial position. Questions regarding maturity dates for currently held CDs were entertained.

† The president requested Pastor Viles to present his summary of August activities. Pastor's report detailed a mileage summary of 46 miles for which reimbursement was requested. Mileage reimbursement amounting to \$30.13 was approved upon a motion offered by Frank Pascoe, seconded by Kathy Meller, and approved via voice vote. Pastor detailed nine meetings with parties both within and outside our congregation. These included the area Ministerial Alliance, Lohman Lions Club, Lohman City Council, Russellville City Council, in addition to S.T.A.R.S., WELCA, and Mutual Ministry. Pastor had numerous personal, phone and e-mail contacts with our parishioners and others.

† Pastor's activities included a funeral for our member Leon Pistel, the baptism of Leland Michael Steward, Bulletin and Epistle preparations, updating of our website and video services, and the posting of verses, photos, and messages on the Church's Facebook site. Pastor conducted two Communion Sunday services and two non-communion services.

President Finch then requested the various Council chairpersons to present their monthly reports:

Evangelism: Delores Vlach gave hearty thanks to Dave and Trish Russell and Jim and Cynthia Loesch for hosting the September Fellowship Coffee on Sept. 3d. Delores was extremely thankful to all who helped plan and carry out the numerous activities for Family Day, Sept. 10th. It was an ideal weather day for the outdoor activities. There were bountiful food dishes [three tables plus the dessert counter]. There were three tables of bingo prizes plus other prizes for winners in the outdoor activities. She thanked the game coordinators who set up and directed the 14 game events in total for all age groups. Delores commented on how we had hoped for a better total turnout and especially for the children and youth. We also should work harder to invite non-church members of the area to attend. Many thanks to the Evangelism Committee members who did an excellent planning job.

Technology: Chairman Dan Tschirgi messaged all Council members that he was beginning work on attempting to silence the video buzz that continues to plague that streaming service. He believes that it will take a test broadcast to try to identify which input line is the source of the problem. The buzzing has become quite annoying for some listeners.

Worship & Music: Kathy Meller reported that her committee met on Tuesday, Sept. 5th. The committee heard continuing praise for Pastor Viles' sermons. Several comments were heard about the difficulty some parishioners have in reading the fine print on the Sunday bulletins, especially the hymns. Pastor will experiment with several variations for printing the Sunday bulletins. The Committee chose Setting 4 for use in September through November. The Sunday October 15th service will be conducted by the women of the Church. October 22nd service, a communion Sunday, will celebrate our Blessing

of the Pets. Parishioners are heartily encouraged to bring large pictures of their pets to be displayed on their blouse/shirts or held in hand. Oct. 29th is Reformation Sunday, a day to wear red to worship. An Advent supper will be held December 10th at 5:30 p.m. The food choices and price will be decided later. The committee members chose hymns for October.

Parish Education: Council members offering comments praised the Sunday School ministry. Additional help would be desirable to aid our present teachers.

Church Improvement: Kent Nelson presented a four-page printout of three bids for carpet replacement to the Council. The bids were from Sommers Interiors of Jefferson City, K.A. Dutcher Paint & Varnish of California, MO., and Howell & Son's Carpet Outlet LLC of Jefferson City. Council members who offered an opinion favored the bid from Sommers Interiors. Kent Nelson's Committee is studying the bids and will make a recommendation to the congregation at an upcoming called Congregational meeting on September 24th. The new kitchen stove has been purchased. The new dishwasher is in place and ready to be installed. Saturday, September 23d will be Church Workday. There was much discussion at the Council Meeting concerning the need to spray and eliminate weeds from Church grounds. There are poison ivy and other noxious weeds around the parsonage, garage, and the Church itself. Volunteers are needed to tackle this work.

Stewardship & Finance: No Report

Mutual Ministry: Chairperson Jana Thompson submitted an e-mailed report to the Council. This Committee met on August 16th. Five members were present. Members were pleased with the increased Sunday School attendance. They expressed the need for the kitchen renovation to be completed before the Chili Supper. The Committee discussed the opening for an additional committee member.

Old Business: None

New Business: With no new business, the meeting was adjourned by the President at 7:43 p.m., followed by a recitation of the Our Father.

Mobile Food Pantry: Audrey Bunch

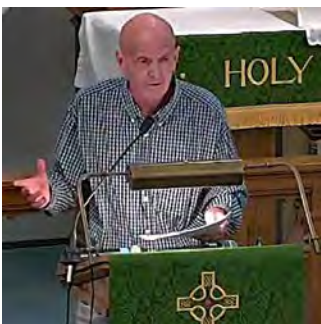
The Mobile Food Pantry was held at Trinity Lutheran Church parking lot September 12th. Thanks to all the volunteers that help with this community service in Russellville. We served 154 families with 430 people in those families. Items given out were cherry tomatoes, potatoes, onions, milk, liquid eggs, deviled eggs, apples, carrots, parmesan cheese, assorted cereals, assorted frozen meats (hamburger, pork steaks, sausage, sliced ham), assorted bakery items, Knorr Pasta and Rice packets, yogurt, canned biscuits, hot dogs, bologna, bacon, shredded cheese, chunk cheese, sliced cheese, cream cheese, deli meats (beef, chicken, turkey), cleaning wipes, and cookies. Volunteers from the Lohman Lions Club were Gary and Alberta Zumwalt, and from St. Paul's were Meredith Benne, Rosemary Heidbreder, Dan Tschirgi, Gary and Audrey Bunch. Next mobile food pantry will be October 10th at 1 P.M.

CONGREGATIONAL MEETING OF SEPTEMBER 24th, 2023: Frank Pascoe Secretary

A Congregational meeting was called to order immediately after the close of the worship service on Sunday September 24th, 2023, by Church Council Vice President Dan Tschirgi. The meeting was



opened with a prayer by Pastor David Viles. Fifty-six congregational members signed the attendance sheets distributed.

Vice-President Tschirgi briefly explained the purpose of the meeting was to determine the Church's direction in going forward on the purchase of new carpeting for the Sanctuary, the Narthex, the stairs, the balcony and the office/Sunday School areas of St. Paul's. Dan Tschirgi then turned the meeting over to the Chairman of the Church Improvement Committee, Mr. Kent Nelson, who has led the search for area companies who were interested in bidding on the project and carrying out the installation needed.



Kent Nelson presented the congregation with the three bids for the project. These were bids from Sommers Interiors of Jefferson City, K.A. Dutcher Paint & Varnish, Inc. of California, Mo., and Howell and Sons Carpet Outlet, LLC of Jefferson City. Mr. Nelson outlined and detailed the advantages and disadvantages of each of the bids. The Church Council had examined and discussed each bid and that it was the opinion of the Church Council, following the recommendation of the Church Improvement Committee, that the bid from Sommers Interiors of Jefferson City was the bid to be recommended to the

Congregation at this meeting. Vice President Dan Tschirgi requested questions and comments from the congregational members present. Questions were entertained regarding the amount of work needed to be done by St. Paul's members prior to and during the installation process; the types of warranty and assurance given by the bidders; the quality of each carpet type; and the time to accomplish the installation. Vice President Dan Tschirgi asked the congregational members present for a motion to proceed with the project. Church member Stacy Bubach moved we accept and go forward with the Sommers Interiors bid. This motion was seconded by church member Rosemary Heidbreder, and agreed to upon a show of hands vote by the members present. No dissenting vote was observed. The congregational meeting was closed by Vice President Dan Tschirgi.
