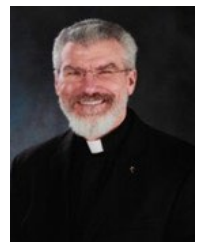

Congregational Council Meeting, October 9, 2023

† A six o'clock pm regular meeting of St. Paul's Church Council met on Monday, October 9th. The meeting was called to order by Council President Zola Finch. Council members present were Stacy Bubach, Kathy Meller, Delores Vlach, and Frank Pascoe. Absent were Council members Jana Thompson, Kent Nelson, and Dan Tschirgi. Also in attendance were Pastor David Viles and Church Treasurer, Kay Pascoe.

† The meeting opened with a prayer from Pastor Viles. The minutes of the previous meeting were approved upon a motion offered by Kathy Meller, seconded by Delores Vlach, and approved via voice vote.

† President Finch requested Pastor Viles present his summary of the past month's pastoral activities. Pastor requested no travel reimbursement. His report detailed nine local and area meetings, including congregational meetings and meetings of the Lohman City Council, Lohman Lion's Club, Area Ministerial Alliance, and the Lohman City Contractor. Pastor noted numerous personal, phone, and electronic contacts with our parishioners and others. He officiated at the wedding of Adam Grunden and Paige Peterson in Boonville, Mo. He worked at Church Clean-up Day, prepared worship bulletins, updated the Church Website and video service, posted updates on the Church Facebook, and created and emailed the September Epistle. Pastor presided at two Communion Sunday services and two non-communion Sunday services in person and on-line.

† President Finch requested that Church Treasurer, Kay Pascoe, present a summary of the past month's financial activities. A four-page summary of the past month's financial activities was distributed to all. The summary showed the Church's sound financial position through September 30th, 2023. The general checking assets showed a total of \$226,916.69 as of the 30th. The total of cash & investments of the same date show \$309,592.71. Expense and operations total for the past month showed \$11,460.78. A delayed bill just received to repair the church Carillon, which was done last year, was noted. There was no explanation found for their delay in billing the Church. It will be paid. A CD from the Farmers Bank of Lohman will be renewed when it expires Oct.14.

President Finch requested the Council members present to discuss their monthly activity reports:

Evangelism: Chairperson Delores Vlach gave hearty thanks to the Leroy Plochberger family for hosting the October 8th Fellowship Hour. This was delayed one week due to the Chili Supper on Sunday, Oct. 1st. Delores announced that our annual 'Trunk or Treat' event will happen on Oct. 31st from 5:30 to 7:00 pm in St. Paul's parking lot. We need to prepare for about 70 young trick-or-treaters. We hope for a fun night for the kids and adults. Delores praised the planners and organizers of the annual Chili Supper. Kathy Meller and Marlene Carlson deserve our thanks and appreciation for their splendid work in this first major event since the basement remodeling. On behalf of her committee and the entire Church Council, Delores wants to give hearty thanks to all who planned and participated in the basement remodeling. To everyone who donated their time, talents, equipment, and money, we give our thanks. Without everyone's collaborative efforts the project would not be the success it is today.

Technology: The technology staff will look into and hope to remedy the glitches that prevented the broadcasting of our Sunday service on Oct. 8th.

Worship & Music: Kathy Meller reported that she was aware that other area churches experienced technical difficulties and internet freezing on the 8th. She reported that the church will be renewing our license to live-stream music and songs. This is an annual fee of \$238.00. Her committee members reported only positive statements on the new Sunday re-vamped bulletins prepared by Pastor Viles. It has been decided to discontinue purchasing the prepared bulletin covers. Kathy's committee members

expressed some reluctance to have Church members move and relocate the desks, tables, shelves, etc. in the Sunday School area prior to the carpet replacement. They hoped that the Sommers contractors would do this instead of parishioners. President Zola will investigate discussing this with the Sommers Interiors contractor.

Her committee will see that communion kits are available again to those reluctant to take communion before the altar. All Saints Sunday, November 5th will honor those who have passed away and those who have been recently baptized. The Church's Thanksgiving Service will be on Wednesday, November 22d at 6:30 pm. The sanctuary will be decorated on Saturday, Nov. 18th. The Sunday October 15th service will be conducted by women of the Church. Erika Gerth and Marlene Carlson will be in charge. A women's choir will sing. Our Blessing of the Pets will be on Sunday, October 22d. Everyone is encouraged to bring pictures of their pets and to display the pictures on their clothes, shirts or hats, or hand held signs. October 29th is Reformation Sunday and all are encouraged to wear red. The bell choir will perform on each first Sunday of the month. It is hoped the choir will sing through November and December.

Special thanks and appreciation were expressed to Jim and Cynthia Loesch who have undertaken to restore the historic angel statues. They were again first displayed on Sunday, October 8th. Special tables to display each statue were beautifully made. The statues will remain on display through October.

It is hoped the annual Advent Dinner will be on Sunday, December 10th, at 5:30 pm. A survey of the congregation will be made in late October to determine just how many parishioners will be interested in the dinner at \$15.00 per person.

Parish Education: It was mentioned again, as in past meetings, that another teacher would be highly desirable to work with the older children who attend Sunday School. It is hoped to have the Bell choir perform a Christmas song on Sunday, December 17th.

Church Improvement: All agreed that the Church Workday went well. Thanks to those who provided the wonderful food. It is planned that a date may be selected for fall aeration and re-seeding of the Church lawn. A date for the carpet installation will be in January. There was brief discussion of the need for some floor mats and cushioning of the existing floor in the kitchen area. Several workers complained of the hardness of the floor for long standing during the chili supper.

Stewardship & Finance: The Church's Stewardship/Finance Committee will meet soon to propose the coming year's budget.

Mutual Ministry: No meeting in the past month. It was mentioned that the required background checks for those who work with our children and youth is upcoming.

Old Business: There was brief discussion of continuing with the VENMO Mobile App. for receiving contributions from online viewers. The use of a prepaid phone and number was discussed.

New Business: Possible new uses for the Blessing Box were briefly mentioned. The President asked the Council to consider revamping and enlarging the duties of a new Altar Guild for 2024. There was discussion of recruiting and redefining the duties of those who are currently participating in the Altar Guild. It is hoped that those currently participating will also participate in communion preparation in addition to the washing of communion ware after services. A planning and discussion meeting will be needed in the coming months prior to January 2024.

The President called the meeting to an end at 7:55 pm. The Pastor led the members in the recitation of the Our Father.

The October 10, 2023 Mobile was held at the Trinity Lutheran Church parking lot on a nice warm fall day. We served 136 families with 354 people in those families. Items given out were: cereal, Triscuit crackers, saltine crackers, frozen potato skins, assorted frozen items: eggo, pancakes, French fries, pizzas, vegetables, juice, ice cream, and meat. Other items toilet paper, produce box: chili cheese, eggs, milk, potatoes, pears, lettuce, corn and onions. Volunteers from the Lohman Lions Club were Gary and Alberta Zumwalt, and from St. Paul's were Rosemary Heidbreder, Dan Tschirgi, and Audrey Bunch. Next mobile will be November 14th.

The weather was exceptional warm for the Chili supper with a great turn out in attendance to dine in and also get carry outs. Had a very good selection of pies and cakes for dining in and for the carry outs. The dish washer worked great in the remodeled kitchen. The Country Store had a good variety of homemade baked goods, produce and hand made items wooden and material. We would like to thank Mark Schroeder for adding more electrical outlets in the kitchen. Also thank Glen and Curt Stubinger for getting the dish washer installed, and stainless steel sheet metal around the stove.

We talked about the Thank offering Service being held October 15th Erika Gerth had worked on getting readers for the various parts of the church service (opening, prayers, lessons, Psalm, sermon, closing prayers). Envelopes were being handed out before and after church services.

Kathryn Linsenbardt and Donita Stubinger volunteered to deliver the quilts to Our Savior's Lutheran Church in Jefferson City for Lutheran World Relief. WELCA made a donation of \$54.00 to ship the quilts we made and donated. We would like to thank both Kathryn and Donita for taking care of this delivery.

We discussed purchasing some 6 and 8 foot white tables to replace the old heavy brown ones.

WELCA will need some stainless steel pots for the new stove. Donita is checking on these so we will have enough to use. Next meeting is scheduled for November 1st at 9:00 A.M.

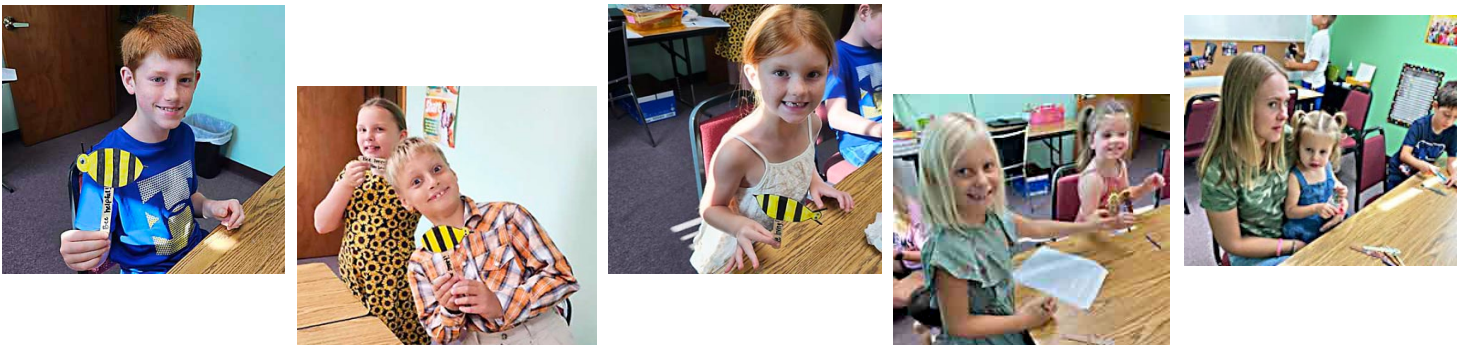
