Pastor's Message

The Birth of Christ our Lord

"Therefore the Lord himself will give you a sign: The virgin will conceive and give birth to a son, and will call him Immanuel." Isaiah 7:14

"For to us a child is born, to us a son is given, and the government will be on his shoulders. And he will be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace." Isaiah 9:6





Congregational Council Meeting, November 13, 2023

† The Minutes for November 13th were collected via e-mail from the Council Members due to the Council President and Vice President being out-of-town on Monday 11/13/2023. An agenda was prepared by Council President Zola Finch and sent to all Council members, to Pastor David Viles, and to Church Treasurer Kay Pascoe.

† Listed for action by President Finch are the following:

- 1. Action Item: approval of the previous minutes of October 9th, 2023
- 2. Action Item: Review of the Church Treasurer's Report
- 3. Action Item: Pastor's Monthly Report/ Approval of Pastor's Mileage. [\$48.47 reimbursement]
- 4. Approval of adding additional cameras and monitor for church/parsonage in amount of \$4,759
- 5. Approval of giving old church front doors to Ryan & Ashley Heidbreder. Currently stored in parsonage garage with no future use planned.
- 6. Approval of proposed budget increase of Pastor's salary by 5% due to inflation, with a decrease of budget amount for church organist.

President Finch requested the Council members email their committee reports:

Evangelism: [Delores Vlach] Thanks were given to the ladies of the Margaret Circle for hosting the November Fellowship coffee. Since this was the last Fellowship Hour of the year, a big THANK YOU is extended to all those members who made the Fellowship Hours so very special during the year. The December Fellowship Hour will be replaced by the Advent Dinner to be held on December 10th. This event is sponsored by the Worship & Music Committee under the superb leadership of Kathy Meller. The dinner will begin at 5:30pm with a short program to follow. Please plan to attend. You will not be disappointed. It will instill in all attendees the Christmas Spirit of the season. Due to cold temperatures, our "Trunk or Treat" on Halloween evening was moved inside to the Fellowship Hall to make everyone more comfortable. Some 70+ children in a wide array of costumes were handed treats from 14 decorated stations. Even an adult Witch and Chicken, aka Debbie and Dee Dee blended in with the costumed kids! Everyone enjoyed a "fun" evening.

Technology: [Dan Tschirgi] Action Item: Consideration of additional cameras and monitor for church/parsonage.

Worship & Music: [Kathy Meller] The Worship and Music Committee meeting was called to order at 9am on November 7th. Pastor Viles opened the meeting with a prayer. Attending were Kathy Meller, Pastor David, Erika Gerth, Abbie Linsenbardt, and Frank Pascoe. Members discussed what they are hearing. Several members of the congregation expressed their pleasure with the Blessing of the Pets service. The All-Saints Sunday Service was also praised. Everyone is enjoying the children playing the bells. They did an excellent job on Sunday, Nov. 5th, playing "We Gather Together". The Thanksgiving service will be on Wednesday, Nov. 22d at 6:30 pm. The Worship Committee will decorate the sanctuary on Saturday, Nov. 18th at 1:00 pm. We will continue to use Setting 4 during Advent. Christ the King Sunday is on Nov. 26th. Advent begins on Dec. 3d. There will be lighting of the Advent Wreath. The day before Christmas is Sunday December 24th. The Bell Choir will perform on Dec. 3d and possibly again on December 24th. Adult Choir will continue to sing during November and December. The Advent Dinner will be held on Dec. 10th, starting at 5:30 p.m. Donita Stubinger has graciously volunteered to cater the meal, with WELCA helping pay for the food. There will be no cost for attending. The program following the meal will be determined by Pastor David. Worship & Music committee plan to decorate on Saturday, December 9th at 9:00 a.m. Our committee will meet again on December 5th at 9:00 a.m.

Church Improvement: [Kent Nelson] There was no committee meeting in Oct. We have placed the down payment on the new carpets and the colors have been selected [thanks to Zola]. Our carpet project has been placed on Sommers' list for tentative installation in January. The Safety and Security committee met on Oct. 22d to discuss safety concerns due to the Middle East conflict. The Committee has a desire to install additional cameras at the parsonage and in the sanctuary. They also wish to install a monitor in the narthex for viewing during the service. The Committee contacted Scott Grunden, and he has furnished a bid for the cameras and associated wiring of \$5,279, with a \$520.00 discount if we help pull the wiring. Roger Pennell has agreed to help with the wiring. This project is for Council consideration at this time. I have reached out to BEE SEEN signs to inquire about the neon cross above the entry door to see if the transformer is out. More to follow. I am currently working on replacing the wood door that leads to the coal room at the Parsonage and possibly replacing the storm door in front. Zola Finch purchased a new front screen door at the Parsonage. Church Improvement will need to install it.

Stewardship & Finance: [Stacy Bubach] Stacy Bubach presented the proposed 2024 Church Budget. This proposed budget will be presented and discussed at the upcoming annual Congregational Meeting in January 2024.

Mutual Ministry: [Jana Thompson] The committee met on October 18th with four members present. The length of terms for our committee members was discussed and two of our members will need to be replaced in the new year. The Venmo account was discussed and background checks for all Church members who work with children will be completed as needed. Pastor David shared with the committee an interest in developing an expanded Altar Guild and what that might entail.

PASTOR VILES monthly Report for October: Mileage for Oct. 1 thru Oct. 31st, 2023: a total of 74 miles at 0.655, including Villa Marie Nursing Home [29 miles]; Ministerial Alliance meeting [13 miles]; Funeral for Steven Dunlap [32 miles] = 74 miles or \$48.47. Pastor Viles detailed ten meetings, including church committee meetings, Lohman City Council, meetings with Lohman City contractor, S.T.A.R.S., area Ministerial Alliance, and MODOT Bridge meeting. Pastor had nursing home visits and counseling sessions, and funeral preparation discussions. There were daily phone and text messaging sessions with our members. Pastor attended the annual Chili Supper. Other activities included the Steve Dunlap funeral, Grunden-Peterson wedding, arranged MODOT meeting in church basement, prepared bulletins and monthly Epistle, and maintained the Church's Facebook page. He presided over two Sunday communion services and three non-communion Sunday services.

Old Business: Agreement and support on the six required action items were received from the following members: Jana Thompson; Delores Vlach; Kathy Meller; Frank Pascoe; and Dan Tschirgi. Kent Nelson approved of all but Item #4 [camera additions].

New Business: Annual Reports from all committees are to be turned in to the Church Secretary Debbie Raithel by December 15.

The Annual Church Congregational Meeting will be held on the third Sunday in January: January 21st New Church Council Members are needed. Begin discussion on recruitment process for new members.
