



The 1st lesson is a reading from Genesis, the 9th chapter.

When the bow is in the clouds, I will see it and remember the everlasting covenant between God and every living creature of all flesh that is on the earth." You are gracious and upright, O Lord; therefore you teach sinners in your way. You lead the lowly in justice and teach the lowly your way.


All your paths, O Lord, are steadfast love and faithfulness to those who keep your covenant and your testimonies.





Hymn History – As we sing our sending song "504 - A Mighty Fortress Is Our God" it is easy to overlook Martin Luther as an accomplished musician. He grew up singing in a boys' choir and became proficient with the recorder. His intense emotions often erupted in song. During the early reformation he worked hard with other musicians to revive congregational singing. Luther sometimes borrowed a secular tune for his hymns, then during criticism was "compelled to let the devil have it back again." His feeling for music is summarized in a book forward he wrote: "Next to the Word of God, the noble art of music is the greatest treasure in the world. It controls our thoughts, minds, hearts, and spirits....A person who...does not regard music as a marvelous creation of God....does not deserve to be a human being; he should be permitted to hear nothing but the braying of asses and the grunting of hogs." Perhaps Luther's bluntness helped make him a reformer! Our hymn today has at least 80 English translations, but all reflect Luther's awareness of our intense struggle with Satan.
