Children's Sermon

WORD

The 1st lesson is a reading from Numbers, the 21st chapter.

From Mount Hor the Israelites set out by the way to the Red Sea, to go around the land of Edom; but the people became impatient on the way. The people spoke against God and against Moses, "Why have you brought us up out of Egypt to die in the wilderness? For there is no food and no water, and we detest this miserable food." Then the Lord sent poisonous serpents among the people, and they bit the people, so that many Israelites died. The people came to Moses and said, "We have sinned by speaking against the Lord and against you; pray to the Lord to take away the serpents from us." So Moses prayed for the people. And the Lord said to Moses, "Make a poisonous serpent, and set it on a pole; and everyone who is bitten shall look at it and live." So Moses made a serpent of bronze, and put it upon a pole; and whenever a serpent bit someone, that person would look at the serpent of bronze and live.

The Word of the Lord. C: Thanks be to God.

Psalm 107 (Read Responsively)

Give thanks to the Lord, for the Lord is good, for God's mercy endures forever.

Let the redeemed of the Lord proclaim that God redeemed them from the hand of the foe,

gathering them in from the lands; from the east and from the west, from the north and from the south.

Some were fools and took rebellious paths; through their sins they were afflicted.

They loathed all manner of food and drew near to death's door.

Then in their trouble they cried to the Lord and you delivered them from their distress.

You sent forth your word and healed them and rescued them from the grave.

Let them give thanks to you, Lord, for your steadfast love and your wonderful works for all people.

Let them offer sacrifices of thanksgiving and tell of your deeds with shouts of joy.

The 2nd lesson is a reading from Ephesians, the 2nd chapter.

You were dead through the trespasses and sins in which you once lived, following the course of this world, following the ruler of the power of the air, the spirit that is now at work among those who are disobedient. All of us once lived among them in the passions of our flesh, following the desires of flesh and senses, and we were by nature children of wrath, like everyone else. But God, who is rich in mercy, out of the great love with which he loved us even when we were dead through our trespasses, made us alive together with Christ—by grace you have been saved—and raised us up with him and seated us with him in the heavenly places in Christ Jesus, so that in the ages to come he might show the immeasurable riches of his grace in kindness toward us in Christ Jesus. For by grace you have been saved through faith, and this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God—not the result of works, so that no one may boast. For we are what he has made us, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand to be our way of life.





Hymn History – Many or most of us have heard the story behind our sending song today "**Amazing Grace**." After living a life on the seas going deeper astray from good morals, he prayed to God to save his life amidst a terrible storm. He wrote "That tenth of March is a day much remembered by me; and I have never suffered it to pass unnoticed since the year 1748 – the Lord came from on high and delivered me out of deep waters." The next several years were of slow spiritual growth as captain of a slave trading ship until he emerged as a powerful evangelical preacher in Britain and a powerful foe of slavery. By the end of his life in 1807 Newton had a very large collection of published works consisting of sermons, letters, devotional aids, and hymns. He called hymns "The fruit and expressions of his own experience." Here is an omitted verse Newton added to "Amazing Grace":

The earth shall soon dissolve like snow, the sun forbear to shine; But God, Who called me here below, shall be forever mine.
