Children's Sermon

WORD

The 1st lesson is a reading from Acts, the 4th chapter.

The next day [the] rulers, elders, and scribes assembled in Jerusalem, with Annas the high priest, Caiaphas, John, and Alexander, and all who were of the high-priestly family. When they had made the prisoners stand in their midst, they inquired, "By what power or by what name did you do this?" Then Peter, filled with the Holy Spirit, said to them, "Rulers of the people and elders, if we are questioned today because of a good deed done to someone who was sick and are asked how this man has been healed, let it be known to all of you, and to all the people of Israel, that this man is standing before you in good health by the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, whom you crucified, whom God raised from the dead. Hymn History – **Hymn History** – Our sending song today "The King of Love My Shepherd Is" is a beautiful rendition of the Twenty-third Psalm. Henry Williams Baker authored the text in the mid 1800's although it has been sung to multiple tunes. Baker was born in 1821, a son of a Vice Admiral in the British Navy. He was ordained at the age of 24 after attending Trinity College. Henry labored greatly on a book of hymns reflecting the grandeur of majestic worship. His work Entitled "Hymns Ancient and Modern" was published in 1861. The book was known by its initials "H. A. and M." Due to Henry's reputation for laboriously pouring over and editing his works, some called it "Hymns Asked for and Mutilated." It became the leading hymnbook in the Anglican church. His friend reported that Henry W. Baker's last words were from our hymn:

"Perverse and foolish oft I started, | But yet in love He sought me, And on His shoulder gently laid, | And home, rejoicing, brought me"
