By its 20th anniversary in 1990, over 200 million people across 141 countries had participated in Earth Day celebrations.

The first Earth Day led to the establishment of the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) in 1970 and the passage of major environmental legislation like the Clean Air and Clean Water Acts. It continues to be celebrated globally with events and activities aimed at promoting environmental protection and sustainability.

As we approach Earth Day, it's a perfect time to reflect on the significance of this global event and the benefits it brings to our planet and all its inhabitants. Earth Day serves as an annual reminder of our collective responsibility to protect and preserve the environment for future generations.

If the world's populations could pull together, many of the problems we have created in this land of milk and honey could be resolved. The ELCA gives us a time in the fall to consider this work with the "God's Work, Our Hands" Sunday to do what we can, but it takes more than one organization to repair the damage the world has suffered at our expense.

Be an advocate for God's original plan to be a caretaker for the earth. Be the hands and feet of God, propelled by the Holy Spirit to make a difference. Start in your own community by picking up litter, planting grass and trees and flowers. Each of us can do God's work with our hands.

Congregational Council Meeting, March 11, 2024

- † A six o'clock pm regular monthly meeting of the Congregational Council of St. Paul's ELCA was called into session by Council President Zola Finch. Council members present were Kent Nelson, A.J. Ferrell, and Frank Pascoe. Also present were Pastor David Viles, Church Treasurer Kay Pascoe, and Devin Koestner. Council members absent were Stacy Bubach, Jana Thompson, and Misty Schroeder.
- † The meeting opened with a prayer offered by Pastor Viles. President Finch requested a motion to approve the Council Minutes of the previous meeting of February 12, 2024. This was done upon a motion offered by A.J. Ferrell, seconded by Kent Nelson, and agreed to via voice vote by all. President Finch announced to the members the agreement by parishioners Devin Koestner and Ashleigh Hillen to accept membership on the Church Council, filling the two currently vacant positions. This was greeted with pleasure by Council members present., and their membership on the Council was agreed to by the current members upon a motion offered by A.J. Ferrell and seconded by Kent Nelson. President Finch requested Church Treasurer Kay Pascoe to give the members an update regarding the church's recent expenditures and its general financial status. Treasurer Kay Pascoe circulated a fourpage Statement of Financial Position to the members present. The Statement showed St. Paul's total cash and investments to be \$312,170.26 dollars; Dedicated accounts totaled \$34,392.55. The current monthly income for February 2024 was \$12,185.93. The Council members discussed the purchasing a new CD at Farmers Bank of Lohman. Kent Nelson, as Church Improvement chair, expressed concern regarding known and unknown upcoming church expenses. After discussion, it was agreed that the Church Treasurer will purchase a new 9-month CD for \$80,000 at 4.75% with the Farmers Bank of The Council briefly discussed the Church Treasurer's replacement. President Finch will advertise the Treasurer's position in appropriate local and area employment sources.
- † President Finch requested Pastor David Viles to present his report of past monthly activities. Pastor's report listed a total of 65 miles for visits to parishioners and meetings. This included visits with members Don Buchta and Cecil Knernschield, and with persons planning weddings at St. Paul's. Pastor had numerous phone and personal conversations with our members. His activities included changing the Carillion Bell songs, moving pews with Kent Nelson in the church balcony, preparing Sunday and mid-week bulletins, posting daily Bible verses, and creating and emailing the February Epistle. Pastor presided over six services in February. There were Sunday worship services, as well as Wednesday evening Lenten services. Council Secretary Frank Pascoe moved the Council pay Pastor's mileage of 65 miles at \$43.55. This was seconded by A.J. Ferrell and approved by all.

President Finch requested the Council members committee reports and activities:

Evangelism: Council member and Evangelism Chair Misty Schroeder submitted an e-mailed report which was circulated to all present. Her report detailed the two meetings her committee members held in the past month. Topics of discussion was the upcoming Easter sunrise service at 6:30 on March 31st. and the breakfast following. St. Paul's Evangelism committee will be serving biscuits and gravy, coffee cake, fresh fruit, juice, and coffee. Her committee members will provide breakfast preparations and set-up. The second topic of discussion was the annual pancake breakfast planned for April 7th. Food preparation in our new kitchen may be a bit different but the menu will remain as before, with pancakes, sausage, scrambled eggs, applesauce, milk, juice, and coffee. The price will be \$10.00 for each adult. Her committee will welcome any volunteers to assist with preparations and serving of the breakfast. Parishioners should see Misty to assist with this event.

Technology: New Council member Devin Koestner will chair this Committee.

Discussion followed concerning the ongoing and re-occurring technical problems with the Church's sound systems, both for in-house and online. Placement of the microphones when the choir sings was

discussed. Since the sound system is not available for the balcony technician, some new use of headphones or other mechanism may be forthcoming to improve the sound technician's control over the sound. It was suggested that Devin Koestner might learn the balcony technician's operations. On the issue of screens in the sanctuary and their placement, an upcoming meeting with Will West, local technician, was to be re-scheduled. Additional installation of security cameras will be addressed.

Safety & Security:

LIABILITY INSURANCE NEEDS: There was extended discussion regarding the need for St. Paul's providing funding for liability insurance for all members of our security team regardless of their being armed when on duty in the church, as current Security Team leadership would like to see liability insurance in place for all Security team members. Pastor and Kent Nelson will pursue this question for further discussion and decisions. President Finch requested Stacy Bubach have Gus Fischer of the Stewardship/Finance committee call Church Mutual Insurance offices to inquire about our obtaining liability insurance for security members in our Congregation. Frank Pascoe suggested that input from other area congregations would be helpful.

Parish Education: Chairperson A. J. Ferrell reported: There will be Sunday School twice monthly beginning in August, with no Sunday School in June. Current attendance is up. Hopefully, there will be a children's Christmas program this coming Christmas. It was suggested that the "Noisy Offerings" be brought back. We could have a children's offering prior to the children's sermon, and the regular offering later in the service. The children would likely enjoy this activity. The possibility of some high school age youth attending this year's upcoming Youth Conference was briefly mentioned. It will be held in New Orleans, July 16-20.

Worship & Music: [former chairperson Kathy Meller had sent Council members a reporting of their March 5th meeting.] Highlights of that meeting were:

Discussion of the Altar Guild meeting of February 18th:. Committee members were happy to see a large number attending, although someone is still needed to step up and become President of the Guild. Marie Scheperle and Kathryn Linsenbardt will continue their duties with Altar Guild with help as needed.

Setting 10 will continue to be used. Committee members will continue to see that wine, apple/grape juice, and communion kits are on hand. Special Services upcoming are Palm Sunday, March 24th. Maundy Thursday, March 28th; Good Friday, March 29th; and Easter Sunrise Service, here at St. Paul's, March 31st, at 6:30 am. Pastor David will set up the Flower Cross at the foot of our front steps. Our Easter Sunday morning Service will be at 9:00 am with two communion stations, followed by the traditional Easter Egg hunt for the children.

St. Paul's Choir and the children's Bell Choir will perform a number of times during March and April. April hymns were selected, and the next Worship & Music committee meeting will be April 2d.

Church Improvement: Chair Kent Nelson reported that the carpet installation bill from Sommers Interiors has been paid [\$11,417.28]. He announced that the upcoming Church Workday will begin at 8:00 am on Saturday March 23th. If that day's weather should prevent work, the alternative workday is scheduled for 8:00 am on Saturday March 30th. A new door for the parsonage is to be in place soon. There will soon be attention to the kitchen refrigerator and its occasional freezing and poor performance; also, the issue of smelly kitchen drains will be addressed.

Stewardship & Finance: No report.

Mutual Ministry: No report.

Old Business: None

New Business: Planning for the July 4th activities need to be addressed soon. Will our activities be held on June 30th? Parsonage Rental: There was brief discussion of the possibility of renting the parsonage when President Finch moves into her new home. Various members present expressed concerns and caution on doing this without careful planning and putting extreme financial safeguards in place. No decision was reached.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:40 pm upon a motion offered by A.J. Ferrell, seconded by Devin Koestner, and approved by all. Pastor Viles and the members closed with a recitation of the Our Father.

Easter Services:


