

**Hymn History** – Our gathering hymn today "Come, We that Love the Lord" was first published in the author's "Hymns and Sacred Songs, 1707." Isaac Watts DD, the father of our hymn author, was a respected Nonconformist, and at the birth of his son Isaac, and during his infancy, twice suffered imprisonment for his religious convictions. In his later years he kept a flourishing boarding school in Southampton. Isacc Watts, our hymn author, showed "remarkable precocity" as a child, studying Latin at age 4, writing respectable verses at age 7, going to advanced study at age 16, and being an assistant minister at age 18. He went on to a prolific career in ministering and writing. He lived from 1674 to 1748. His grave was marked with the inscription "Happy, will be that reader whose mind is disposed, by his verses or his prose, to imitate him in all but his non-conformity, to copy his benevolence to men, and his reverence to God."
