Pastor's Message

It's Summer, No School, Work Vacations. What will I do with all this time off?

"Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly...And whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him." Colossians 3:16-17

Congregational Council Meeting, June 10, 2024

- † A six o'clock pm regular monthly meeting of the Congregational Council of St. Paul's ELCA was called into session by Council President Zola Finch. Council members present were A.J. Ferrell, Stacy Bubach, Jana Thompson, Misty Schroeder, and Frank Pascoe. Absent were Kent Nelson, Devin Koestner and Ashleigh Hillen. Also attending were Church Treasurer Kay Pascoe and Pastor David Viles.
- † The meeting opened with a prayer and devotion by Pastor Viles. His devotion focused on "when is enough, enough". Since God's grace is never ending, our best efforts should be focused on extending grace, patience and compassion.
- † President Finch called for a motion to approve the minutes of last month's Council meeting. This was done upon a motion by Misty Schroeder, seconded by A.J. Ferrell, and agreed to by all. President Finch requested Church Treasurer Kay Pascoe to present a summary of the Church's financial status. The Treasurer distributed a four-page summary of expenses, and current financial position. The year-to-date balance of all accounts totaled \$300,011.29 dollars, with total dedicated accounts at \$34,392.55. May 2024 income totaled \$12,610.58; expenses totaled \$12,989.02, leaving a monthly deficit of \$(378.44). The Treasurer had concerns about checks written to the Russellville Public School Dist. in January, which have not been cashed. It was agreed that the Treasurer would ask the bank to stop payment on them. The Treasurer's report was accepted upon a motion offered by Misty Schroeder, seconded by Jana Thompson, and agreed to by all.
- † The President requested that Pastor David Viles present his monthly summary of activities. Pastor reported minimal mileage for May 2024, and requested no mileage compensation. He reported on six church and community meetings involving the Lohman Lion's Club, Lohman City Council, S.T.A.R.S., and Mutual Ministry. May activities included numerous personal meetings with parishioners, wedding planning, funeral detailing, and prayers with others in the wider community. Pastor attended a four-hour CPR class held in the Church along with parishioners Roger Pennell, Melvin Stubinger, and Gary Elliott. Pastor created and emailed the May Epistle and updated the Church's website with bulletin and video services. He presided over two Communion Sunday worship services in-person, and two non-Communion Sunday services, with online and Facebook presentations. President Finch requested Council approval of Pastor's monthly report, which was done upon a motion offered by Misty Schroeder, seconded by Stacy Bubach, and agreed to by all.

President Finch requested Council Chairpersons to report on May 2024 activities:

Evangelism: Chairperson Misty Schroeder discussed ongoing planning for the annual 4th of July celebration which will be held on Sunday June 30th. There is still work to be done on assembling a complete work team for the various activities. Misty will meet with Roger Pennell and others to make certain that the parking and safety arrangements are made. There is a need for a detailed list of all the days' activities. Questions were raised about MO DOT phasing out "Adopt-a-Highway program and its signs". Pastor will decide when and how to preserve St. Paul's signs along Route D. Misty reported that planning for a Spaghetti Supper is on hold.

Technology: President Finch led the technology discussion. There was extended commentary and comments from the congregation on Devin Koestner's display of the cardboard examples of how the permanent screens will look and be displayed. Council members seemed to be mostly successful in allaying the concerns of parishioners who had questions about the location and display of the screens. President Finch presented to the Council members present some privacy concerns about St. Paul's live streaming of various Sunday activities, including the Children's Sermons and baptism celebrations. Council members agreed that our technicians directing live-streaming online would divert the cameras on these occasions as needed. The Church may also on some occasions re-arrange how our children's activities are arranged when live-streamed and gathered in front of the congregation on a Sunday.

Worship & Music: There was no committee meeting in May, but the members selected July hymns via email; the Choir will be taking a break during July Sunday services. A number of parishioners and Council members expressed pleasure at the choice of Setting 8 continuing to be used through August.

Parish Education: Chairperson A.J. Ferrell reported her hope that a good number of our children and Youth will plan to attend this year's Vacation Bible School. There is \$500 in the budget to support Vacation Bible School. We had around ten students attending last year, and the hope is that we will have this many or more attending this year. Our own Sunday School will begin again starting on Sunday July 7th.

Church Improvement: It was reported that our request to Ameren to assist in cutting some tree branches around the church property was declined. Temperature settings within the church basement and sanctuary were briefly discussed, as some parishioners have commented on some Sunday services with uncomfortable sanctuary temperatures. Council members on duty each Sunday should check the temperature settings and adjust as needed. We do encourage parishioners who find themselves in uncomfortable situations to dress warmly in the air-conditioned sanctuary.

Stewardship & Finance: Chairperson Stacy Bubach reported no Committee meeting but did report on her contact with a parishioner who has expressed interest in becoming Church Treasurer with the upcoming departure of Kay Pascoe, who has filled this position in recent years. The present Treasurer has filled the position without compensation. The Council briefly discussed an appropriate salary range for a new Church Treasurer.

Mutual Ministry: Chairperson Jana Thompson's Committee met on May 15th. All members were present including new member Mitch Plochberger. Discussion followed about the necessary planning for the upcoming Sunday June 30th activities. Roger Pennell spoke about the safety and security planning and offered to meet with Misty Schroeder to make sure that necessary actions will be taken as several members who usually do these safety measures will not be present this year. Discussion also focused on the planning and installation of the screens and the committee's concerns that the congregation be fully aware of what is to take place. Tree removal was briefly discussed. Pastor Viles discussed his ongoing work on a "Safety & Security Policy". It was hoped that the church's "Blessing Box" could be put to some desirable function soon. It was discussed that it might be turned into a "Book Offering Box", and periodically filled with books for all ages, perhaps on a "bring one, take one" basis. Other Council members present at tonight's Council meeting thought this an excellent idea. This suggestion will be discussed more soon. The Mutual Ministry Committee will meet again on June 19th.

Old Business: President Finch briefly informed the Council members that the Safety & Security Committee is currently inactive. Council member Stacy Bubach asked the Council to consider the ushers' difficulty each Sunday of gathering the offering from those attending. She and several other members spoke about how widely spaced the congregation sits, and the difficulty this creates for passing the offering plate along the pew. One option would be to collect each attendee's contribution as each enters the church; if this were done, one usher could present it at the proper time during the service. Other options were heard concerning the gathering of each Sunday's offering. No decision was made at this meeting.

New Business: Pastor Viles called the Council members' attention to the fact that this year 2024 is the 100th anniversary of the construction of our present building that is St. Paul's Church. It was built in 1924! How do we plan to celebrate? After much discussion, a date of Sunday October 27th was decided upon. There were numerous suggestions and Pastor Viles will present our decision to celebrate on October 27th to the congregation. A committee for planning the festivities will be necessary, which will come about in the near future. Volunteers are needed and it is hoped that present day descendants of our founding fathers will be core members of the committee.

President Finch announced that our July Council meeting on July 8th will be via internet participation.

At 8:06 the President called for adjournment of the meeting, which was accomplished by Kent Nelson's motion, seconded by Misty Schroeder, and agreed to by all. A motion to adjourn was offered by A.J. Ferrell, seconded by Jana Thompson. President Finch declared the meeting over at 7:55 pm. A recitation of the Our Father was led by Pastor Viles.
