# **Pastor's Message**

"But you are a chosen people, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's special possession, that you may declare the praises of him who called you out of darkness into his wonderful light." 1 Peter 2:9

In the darkest hours of my life, when the shadows of grief threatened to engulf me, I found comfort within the very congregation I had sworn to guide and protect. As your pastor, I saw my role as one of strength, a light of hope for those navigating life's turbulent waters. Yet, when my beloved Donna entered hospice, and soon after died, I found myself adrift,

wrestling with a pain so profound it threatened to shatter heart.

It was in this moment of vulnerability that I witnessed the true power of our church community. The flock I had tended for years transformed into a host of angels, your wings of compassion surrounding me in a warmth I had never known possible. Every day brought new acts of kindness – meals delivered to my door, ensuring I was nourished even when grief stole my appetite. My neighbor mowing my lawn, and many offerings of help from others. In the stillness, when loneliness threatened to consume me, my phone would light up with messages of encouragement and prayers. Cards filled my mailbox. When I returned to Sunday services, I was welcomed with a shared journey of healing. As I stood at the pulpit, my voice sometimes faltering, the congregation's eyes met mine with understanding and love. You didn't expect perfection; you simply offered your presence, your silent support speaking volumes louder than any sermon I could deliver.

Your words were a comfort to my breaking heart. As the initial shock of loss became a quieter grief, the congregation continued to stand by me. My solitude was respected when the need arose, yet I knew I wasn't alone. Now two months later, my heart surges with gratitude. In my darkest hour, my congregation became the light, expressing the very essence of Christian love and community that I had always preached about. You have taught me the profound truth that even shepherds sometimes need tending, and in doing so, you have not only restored my faith but deepened it immeasurably.

To my beloved St. Paul's congregation, I offer my deepest thanks.

You have been the hands and feet of Christ, and through your love, I have experienced the healing power of true Christian fellowship.

# Congregational Council Meeting, October 14, 2024

**†** A six o'clock pm regular monthly meeting of the Congregational Council of St. Paul's ELCA was called into session by Council President Zola Finch. Council members present were Kent Nelson, Jana Thompson, Misty Schroeder, and Ashleigh Hillen. Council members absent were A.J. Ferrell, Stacy Bubach, Frank Pascoe and Devin Koestner. Also present were Pastor David Viles and Church Treasurer Michelle Collins.

**†** The meeting was opened with prayer by Pastor Viles. President Finch requested approval of the previous Council minutes. This was accomplished upon a motion by Kent Nelson, seconded by Jana Thompson, and agreed to by all.

**† Church Treasurer:** Church Treasurer Michelle distributed a summary of Church expenses and income. Her report was approved upon a motion by Misty Schroeder, seconded by Kent Nelson and approved by all.

**† President Finch:** requested that Pastor Viles present his report.

**† Pastor Viles:** Pastor announced that he would no longer request his mileage be reimbursed. His report listed five meetings, including one with staff of Trimble Funeral Home, one with Church Council, Fruendschaft Gruppe, S.T.A.R.S., and Worship & Music. Pastor Viles detailed seven meetings and dinners with various Church members, and numerous phone and personal visits and prayers with congregational members. His activities included a wedding rehearsal and wedding for Justin Campbell and Brenna Aulbur, and the cremation service for Donna Viles at Trimble Funeral Home. Pastor supplied the printed hymns for Sunday bulletins, updated St. Paul's website, and created the Sept/Oct Epistle. Pastor presided over one Communion Sunday in person, and three non-communion services online with Facebook, with three Lay Leaders officiating. Pastor Viles reported on the inactivity of the area Ministerial Alliance, which was originally ten churches but no longer has activities planned. St. Paul's will no longer participate.

**President Finch:** requested reports from Committee Chairpersons:

**Evangelism:** Misty Schroeder reported that an upcoming committee meeting will discuss the recent Chili Supper's results and income. Preliminary results indicate an increase in funds raised over last year. This may have been due to increased donations this year. Her committee will work on stream-lining the tasks of workers and improving their schedules. Misty's Committee is working with Debbie Boyce on the 100-year Celebration and its ongoing planning. There is a sign-up sheet on the bulletin board in the narthex for those who are bringing potluck dishes to this event. Misty reported that the train ride to Hermann, Mo. was very successful.

**Technology:** There is no update on screens for the sanctuary. Discussion concluded that the cameras working during the Sunday children's sermon will be diverted away from the children's faces for security reasons. It was announced that Council member Devin Koestner has resigned from Church Council. A new Technology Chairman will be needed.

**Worship & Music:** Chair Ashleigh Hillen reported on the Oct. 1st meeting of this committee. Five members were in attendance. The church will be decorated on Nov. 16th for the Thanksgiving Sunday service. Kathryn Linsenbardt will get roses for All Saints Sunday. The Bell Choir will perform on Christ the King Sunday, Nov. 24th. VBS music will be played in the future at an appropriate time during the Sunday service. The choir will perform on the following Sundays: Nov. 3d; Nov. 10th; and Nov. 24th. Hymns were selected for November. Next meeting for this committee is Nov. 5th.

Parish Education: Youth Ministry: no meeting/no report [A.J. Ferrell]

**Church Improvement:** Kent Nelson reported that the planned tree trimming has been postponed. He reported that the illuminated cross on the front of the church had failed. Bee Seen Signs will be asked to replace the fixture with LED due to the failure of the neon tubing and its leaking gas. The Church is required to have an electrical inspection by our insurance provider, Church Mutual Insurance Co. The lighting in the Church Office has been replaced with new ballast.

**Stewardship & Finance:** Chairperson Stacy Bubach reported the Committee is planning to meet on Monday the 28th of October to discuss the 2025 Church Budget.

Mutual Ministry: Chairperson Jana Thompson: No meeting/no report

**New Business:** Zola Finch reported that the October Mission offering envelope would go to Lutheran Disaster Response to aid the people affected by the hurricanes. This was agreed to upon a motion by Jana Thompson, seconded by Kent Nelson, and agreed to by all.

There will be no November Council Meeting. The meeting then adjourned. A recitation of the Our Father was led by Pastor Viles.


