Pastor's Message

Mother's Day Devotion

Her children arise and call her blessed; her husband also, and he praises her: Proverbs 31:28

Motherhood is one of the most beautiful and challenging callings God has created. It calls us to honor the love, sacrifice, and tireless work they pour into their families. Mothers give of themselves in countless ways, nurturing, teaching, comforting, and guiding. Often, their sacrifices seem small in the moment: preparing a meal, wiping away a tear, offering an encouraging word when it's needed. Mothers see potential where others see limitations. They cultivate dreams, nurture talents, and create safe spaces where their children can grow and thrive.

Arise and express your love. Every "thank you" uplifts her heart, every moment of appreciation is a reminder of her worth. Acknowledging her contributions is a profound way we can return love.

Mothers are living legacies of strength, compassion, and resilience. Their stories are not written in books, but in the hearts of the people they love. Their action extends beyond their families, creating ripples of kindness and grace that touch entire communities.

WELCA Mid-Missouri Spring Gathering - Erika Gerth



The clouds hung low on Saturday morning, April 26, 2025, as the temperature hovered around the mid-fifties. Grateful that it was not raining, Marie Scheperle, Kathryn Linsenbardt, Audrey Bunch, Rosemary Heidbreder and I piled into Donita Stubinger's van and off we went to St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Cole Camp for the Mid-Missouri Spring Gathering! We arrived in time to enjoy pastries, fruit and coffee prior to the beginning of the meeting.

Settled into our seats in the church's beautiful sanctuary, we were welcomed by members of our

host church and introduced to the day's theme, "Faith Working Through Love," based on Galatians 5:6b. WELCA gatherings always include hymn sings and today was no exception. Three very talented ladies from Our Savior's, Camdenton, selected six hymns, each of which was related to the day's theme and sung with enthusiasm by the 38 women in attendance. The morning's Bible study was also based on Galatians 6:5b, and was presented by Cole Camp's Pastor Stephen Zeller. He explained the background for the verse, and that according to the apostle Paul, faith is the only thing that counts, and faith expresses itself through action, which is love.

Updates from Central States Women of the ELCA were presented by Gloria Sharp, President, Our Savior's Jefferson City, and Janice Gerken, Treasurer, St. Paul's Cole Camp. What would a church meeting be without good food? The ladies of Cole Camp provided a wonderful assortment of salads and desserts for us to enjoy during lunch. The Coconut Cake received rave reviews — ask Rosemary, she managed to get the recipe!

A prime example of "faith through love" was a tour of Cole Camp's preschool and daycare center. The congregation recognized the need for a half-day program for preschoolers and six years ago began such a program in the basement of the church. More recently, as the need in the community for full-day child care became more evident, the church met that need as well. Truly, the establishment of the Little Blessings Day Care and Preschool is an example of faith in action!

The afternoon's guest speaker was Connie McCray, Director and founder of Hope5One, an organization working to give hope and freedom from human trafficking, based in Warsaw, MO. Connie spoke about this problem which occurs not just in big cities, but in rural communities as well. She talked about how girls and young women get caught up in trafficking and the need for education, intervention, and treatment. The organization is a faith-based, non-profit, 501c3 organization, works closely with local and state partnerships. It also offers short term hotel rooms and meets needs for recently rescued survivors, trains volunteers and staff and hosts community awareness events. Connie McCray and her team are yet one more example of faith in action! A Love Offering was received to which our St. Paul's WELCA contributed \$200.00 toward a total of \$1,101.00. Central States Women of the ELCA and the Little Blessings Day Care and Preschool each received \$550.50. The special offering to benefit Hope5One totaled \$506.00, \$50.00 of which was contributed by our own congregation's WELCA.

All of us from Lohman are grateful for the opportunity to participate in this gathering. Special thanks to Donita for driving and Marlene Carlson for designing the beautiful invitations for the Fall Gathering, to be held at St. Paul's, Lohman, on September 27, 2025!
