Pastor's Message

Be Prepared

"Be dressed ready for service and keep your lamps burning, like servants waiting for their master to return." Luke 12:35-36

It's that time of year again. Backpacks are being dusted off, pencils sharpened, and folders stacked in bright colors, each one ready for the first day of school on August 20th.

Students in all grades are preparing to return to the classroom. Preparation is a big part of a strong start.

At Cole R1 School District, our local churches are pitching in

to make that start a little easier. St. Paul's has been collecting school folders, paper towels, and boxes of tissue for the community wide school supply giveaway. It's a way to say, "We care. We're with you."

But all this practical preparation points to a deeper truth Jesus spoke. Like students getting ready for school, Jesus calls His followers to be ready, alert, and expectant, but not for school. He speaks of something far more eternal: His return.

Being ready for Christ doesn't come with a list of supplies we can check off. It's not about folders or pencils. It's about hearts that are watching, and lives that are faithful. It's about living each day with purpose, love, and a clear eye on the One who has promised to come back.

Think of how much effort goes into preparing a child for school: setting routines, shopping for supplies, organizing rides, calming nerves. Now imagine if we prepared our spirits with the same care. What if we made space each day for prayer the way we make space for breakfast? What if we offered forgiveness as quickly as we hand out school supplies? What if we carried the Word of God with the same readiness as a student carries their backpack?

Jesus tells us to be like servants ready for their master to return at any hour. That means living each day in faithful obedience, not out of fear, but out of love and trust. Our time, our attention, and our service, is part of how we "keep our lamps burning." So as we help students prepare for

another school year, let it also remind us to prepare ourselves spiritually. Let's be ready people—ready to give, ready to serve, and ready to meet our returning Savior.

And while we hand out folders and tissues, may we also hand out grace. **Amen**

Congregational Council Meeting, June 9th, 2025

† Congregational Council Meeting, July 14th, 2025

The regular monthly meeting of the Congregational Council of St. Paul's ELCA, Lohman, Missouri was canceled for the lack of members available during Vacation Bible School that week held at Trinity Lutheran Church in Russellville.

† Church Treasurer's report emailed by Michelle.

June 30, 2025 financial statements show YTD the church has income over expenses of \$4,062.60 and are tracking in line with the budget. The church is financially healthy.

- A new CD was initiated in the amount of \$60,000 as requested at the June meeting.
- We received a CD interest payment in June of \$897.33.
- Information Technology account (5414) shows a negative amount for June due to receiving a donation from Misty for a new computer but the expense not hitting until July.
- I contacted GFI about the increase notices and they stated they do not send notices, as they consider the contract itself the notice. It would simply be an increase on the April bill each year.

† Pastor's report: Pastor emailed his report.

Pastor attended 7 meetings including the annual Central States Synod Assembly. He presented his mileage report for the trip to Olathe, KS which requested 343 miles to be paid at 1/2 the standard federal rate of 70 cents per mile. (343 miles x 0.35 = 120.00) The Church Council member voted by email to approve his mileage and pay this amount.

He had several visits with two families to arrange baptisms in July. He also responded to daily text messages and phone calls and communications.

Activities included attending Synod Assembly and writing a 4 page report on the assembly. Created embroidered baptism napkins for the three baptized. Ordered and set up two laptop computers for the secretary and his office. Created the July Epistle and posted it online. Updated the website with video services. Worked with the Technology committee to configure the two TV monitors and create a new bulletin format to broadcast.

Held three noncommunion services, and two communion services.

President Finch: requested our committee chairpersons to present their reports on recent activities by email.

Technology: Dan Tschirgi reported on technology. Our TV screens in the sanctuary are being used now and all of the worship service is being cast to the two screens. Using a laptop, Pastor Viles was able to get the presentation into portrait mode using the entire TV screens and the slides are changed with a handheld remote that can be used from anywhere in the sanctuary. Council members have been operating the remote during our worship services. This seems to be working very well. Paper bulletins are still being printed and some are still preferring to listen, read, or sing using the paper copy. Thanks to Pastor David for all of the effort to get this working.

Worship & Music: Ashleigh Hillen reported that hymn choices were chosen via email by the participating committee members. Thank you to Kathy Meller for sending out hymn choices, then creating the list of hymns for August.

Parish Education: A.J. Ferrell reported by email.

VBS week was wild! Total I believe we had 18 kids from St. Paul's attend VBS at Trinity last week (including Marie's grandson Jackson). Fun was had by all! Huge thanks to Misty and all her work feeding the huge crowd of around 75 kids this year - the highest number Anna said she'd ever had. We had many volunteers helping with food serving, craft making, and leading in various ways!

Looking ahead: I plan to start gathering materials to start planning the Christmas program soon. I'd like to consider dates early so parents can plan well in advance. Want to solidify a date in the fall for sure.

August Sunday school will be the first Sunday, starting in September we will go back to 2 Sundays - first and third Sundays of the month.

Church Improvement: Kent Nelson reported by email.

A water leak in the parsonage was repaired last month so that the kitchen and bathrooms are available for during meetings that may be conducted in the parsonage.

A new keyless lock was installed last month to facilitate ease of entry for people wishing to use the parsonage for meetings and events. The code can be obtained from Pastor David, Kent Nelson, or in the church office.

There has been an ongoing issue with the air conditioning in the sanctuary. A blower motor was replaced and a follow-up call with the mechanical contractor to check performance is being scheduled. There was discussion at the last council meeting regarding building a permanent structure for the trash dumpster by the main road. A review of current MoDOT right of way requirements suggests that the structure should be approximately 22 feet from the centerline of Route D. Based off measurements, the structure would need to be just off the asphalt turnout from the driveway. A donation of vinyl fence to place around the dumpster has been offered.

Stewardship/Finance: Gus Fischer, no report this month.

Mutual Ministry: Debbie Raithel emailed her report.

Mutual Ministry met on Wednesday, June 11 at 5:30 at the parsonage. We had 3 members plus pastor David in attendance. Pastor started with an opening prayer. Discussion of topics were the Fireworks Celebration, placing the trash cans at the bottom of the hill and items received for the parsonage. Still working on replacing the broken plexi glass in one of the church windows. We had someone express interest in replacing some of the trees in the cemetery. Some of the trees were lost to storms. Next meeting was set for July 16, but cancelled because of VBS.
