Hymn History — St. Francis of Assisi (1181-1226) was an Italian friar, deacon, and mystic who founded the Franciscan Order, the largest order in today's Catholic Church committed to poverty, humility, and service, with an emphasis on living in harmony with all of creation and serving the poor. He is the patron saint of Italy and the environment, known for his love of animals as well as the poor and peace. He was originally known for his love of fine clothes, partying, and his interest in troubadours. He adopted a life of voluntary poverty after a spiritual awakening, inspired by scripture. The text of our gathering song "All Creatures, Worship God Most High" was written by him, and the tune for the hymn came along about 400 years later.
