# **Pastor's Message**

Faith in Action

"I can do all things through Him who strengthens me."

Philippians 4:13

During the past few weeks, we have heard about Faith, a gift from God, a gift that sustains us, guides us, and moves us to action. In a world filled with uncertainty, pain, and division, faith can feel like the only steady thing we have.

But sometimes we wonder: Is my faith enough? Can I really make a difference?

Paul's words in Philippians 4:13 remind us that our faith isn't

about what we can do on our own. It's about what God can do through us. "I can do all things through Him who strengthens me." Whether our faith feels big or small, God promises to work through it to accomplish his purposes.

Faith isn't just an abstract belief or a quiet feeling in our hearts, it's a call to trust God and take action. It's Abraham stepping out into the unknown because God told him to go. It's Mary saying yes to God's plan, even when it seemed impossible. It's ordinary people throughout history serving, sacrificing, and loving in ways that change the world.

In our troubled world, faith is desperately needed. There are so many people who feel lost, lonely, or hopeless. There are communities torn apart by poverty, violence, and despair. As Lutherans, we know that faith alone saves us, but that same faith calls us to respond to God's grace by serving our neighbors in love.

# What can we do with the faith we've been given? A lot.

With faith, we can comfort the grieving by listening, praying, and simply being present. With faith, we can feed the hungry by donating to a food pantry or sharing a meal with a neighbor. With faith, we can spread hope by encouraging someone who feels forgotten or overwhelmed.

When we put our faith into action, we become God's hands and feet in the world. We may not be able to solve every problem or heal every hurt, but when we trust God and step out in faith, he multiplies our efforts.

So, whether your faith feels strong or small today, remember: It is enough. God works through us, not because we are powerful, but because he is. Trust in him. Take a step. Share his love. And watch what he can do through you.

# **Congregational Council Meeting, September 8, 2025**

- † At 6:04 pm the regular monthly meeting of the Congregational Council of St. Paul's ELCA, Lohman, Missouri was called into session by Council President Zola Finch. The council members present were, Gus Fischer, Zola Finch, Pastor David, Debi Berry, Michelle Collins, Misty Schroeder, and A.J. Ferrell. Those not in attendance were Ashleigh Hillen, Dan Tschirgi, Debbie Raithel, Kent Nelson (phone attendance). The meeting was started with a prayer by Pastor David Viles.
- † The President requested approval of the previous Council minutes; this was done upon a motion by AJ Ferrell, seconded by Misty Schroeder, and approved by all.
- **t Church Treasurer's report** provided by Michelle Collins was as of August 31, 2025, financial statements show YTD the church has income over expenses of \$5,202.65 and are tracking in line with the budget. The church has over 12 months of cash in reserves which exceeds the not-for-profit standard of a minimum of six months. The church is financially healthy. The Church earned interest on the CD this month of \$222.00.
  - A motion was made by Debi Berry and seconded by Gus Fischer to approve the treasurer's report. Approved by all.
- **Pastor's report** Pastor attended 6 meetings. He had seven visits and answered text messages and phone calls daily, personal conversations, prayers, and met with a potential new member. Activities were varied (9). Attended Viola Gordon burial and lunch. Blessed the backpacks during worship service on 17 August 2025. Met with contractor two times for Fellowship Hall A/C inspections for quotes. Completed all work on the photo directory and sent the package in to Universal Church Directories. It was delivered at 10:29 am on 2 September 2025 in Mansfield, OH. Loaded and delivered the Back-to-School supplies to Trinity in Russellville. Creation of August Epistle and emailed. Converted bulletin format and set up each Sunday for screens. Updated website with service videos. Updated calendar for basement events. Pastor held 2 non-communion services and 2 communion services in person and on Facebook Live.

**President Finch**: requested our committee chairpersons to present their reports on recent activities.

**Evangelism**: Family day was September 7th. It was well attended, thankful for the beautiful weather. A Steve's fried Chicken and family potluck started off our day. Thank you for all that joined in the festivities and assisted with a special thank you to Dana Frisby from Trinity Lutheran Church for the bounce house, Kathy Meller for the rock painting, Dave and Trish Russell for taking care of the fish pond and prizes and all who donated bingo prizes.

Planning is underway for the chili supper. Please let a committee member know if you cannot work a shift or bring items you have typically done in the past. Many have voiced concern over the air conditioning situation and possibly not having the chili supper. More discussion to follow on that. Planning for the community Ham and Bean supper and the cookie sale for 7 Dec 2025.

**Technology:** Dan Tschirgi reported (by written copy) on technology. Wisper Internet has been contacted and received great customer support as described in my report below. We are still experiencing freezes in our Facebook streaming. The audio stream continues but an approximate one-minute procedure must be done by the operator to restore the video stream. Wisper Internet is willing to monitor the data flow during future livestreams to look for overloads to determine if that is the problem. We will call them when the livestreams start.

**Worship & Music:** Ashleigh Hillen has vacated the position of Chair for Worship and Music. Pastor spoke with Carol Elliott to fill in for Ashleigh Hillen's remaining tenure. Carol agreed to take notes and help as needed for this committee. Pastor David will report on this committee for Church Council purposes. The committee met on September 2, 2025, at 9:00 a.m. in the Friendship Hall. Those

attending were Kathy Meller, Carol Elliott, Erika Gerth, Kathryn Linsenbardt, and Pastor Viles. The meeting began at 9:05 a.m. with a prayer from Pastor.

The hymns for October were selected from the list Kathy Meller obtained from Sunday and Seasons. We are now using Setting 4 and will continue until at least the Advent season.

Several members are still using the printed bulletins, and we will continue to have the Secretary print them as needed. Pastor Viles suggested the printed bulletins be placed on the Narthex table and have the greeters let people know where they are if they would like one. The thought is that some who do not use them will accept one if handed directly to them. Dec 14, 2025 is the date for the Advent dinner. Time and Talent sheets were discussed and suggested they be sent out now with a deadline of November 1st for response. Pastor Viles said he would share last years Time and Talent form with the Church Council for change recommendations.

Blessing of the Pets was confirmed for October 19th with members bringing photos of their pets and possibly an animal or two that are trained to be around people.

Pastor Viles will announce the option for parents to sign up their children for 1st Communion and Confirmation. A signup form will be posted and collected electronically. Using the results Pastor will determine the best day and time to meet.

**Parish Education:** A.J. Ferrell reported Sunday School – Searching for some youth lessons to use. Grants for playground are still being researched. They are still working on the dates for the Christmas Program, tentatively planned for Dec 21, 2025, and school will be out starting Friday prior. More information to follow.

Church Improvement: Kent Nelson reported by phone. There was a discussion regarding all bids received thus far for the Fellowship Hall air conditioner replacement. Two more bids will be obtained by Friday of this week. Pastor will meet with them on Friday. The bids will be reviewed by the Church Improvement Committee, and an email will be sent to that committee for review. The Plexiglass over the front stained-glass window fell out. We need to replace it to protect the wood. Suggested replacing them all so that they match. Roger Pennell is working on an estimate. Kent will continue to follow up. A housing/storage place at the bottom of the church hill near the street was discussed for church dumpster. Storing the dumpster at the bottom of the hill would alleviate the chore of having to drag it down the hill once a week for trash pick-up. Instead, bags of trash would be taken down the hill to the dumpster. Discussion will continue.

**Stewardship/Finance:** No report.

**Mutual Ministry:** Debbie Raithel was not here but Pastor reported on the use of the Talent Sheets. We need to confirm all names of members and immediate family to be announced on All Saints Sunday, November 2, 2025. This includes non-members who are a spouse, parent, sibling, or grandparents. There will not be an October Church Council meeting as President Finch will be out of town. All council reports will be provided by email and a consolidation of those reports will be compiled.

**Old Business:** None

**New Business:** The Church Council addressed recent concerns regarding the use of the church basement to ensure clarity and proper coordination moving forward, the Council decided that all groups and individuals using the church facilities must post their event(s) on the church calendar in a timely manner and must provide a copy of liability insurance in order to relieve the church of liability. This process will help maintain transparency, protect the church, and support the safe and fair use of the facilities for all. In addition, the Rental Agreement for Church Basement will be signed for all events, and the appropriate fee will be collected. Pastor David led the Council in the Lord's Prayer at 7:08pm At 7:09 pm. Misty Schroeder made a motion to adjourn, seconded by AJ Ferrell. All approved motion. Respectfully submitted by Council Secretary, Debi Berry

That's where 25 seniors gathered on September 17th to enjoy a scrumptious buffet featuring fork-tender roast beef, numerous sides, and delicious desserts. Our speaker was Melinda Jennings, Director of Development at Jefferson City's Salvation Army Center of Hope. Melinda gave a brief overview of the Salvation Army, the kinds of support it makes available to individuals in the community struggling with addiction, food insecurity, or lack of housing. Currently the Center of Hope can house 31 persons. A fundraising campaign is underway for a major renovation of space which could double the occupancy, including special family units. It was our pleasure to present Melinda with a check in the amount of \$500.00 to be applied to the Salvation Army's "Hope Lives Here" campaign.

### FLU SHOT CLINIC AT ST. PAUL'S - OCTOBER 15, 2025



Flu season is just around the corner! The CDC recommends everyone six months and older get an annual flu vaccine. Why is this important? An annual flu shot is the best way to protect against flu and its potentially serious complications. Flu vaccination has been shown to reduce the risk of getting sick with flu and also to reduce the risk of more serious flu outcomes that can result in hospitalization or even death.

St. Paul's flu shot clinic will take place in conjunction with STARS on Wednesday, October 15th. Registered nurses from the Cole County Health Department will be at St. Paul's from 11:20 AM until 12:20 PM. You will need your Medicare, Medicare Advantage or other health insurance card. Regular and high dose vaccines will be available. Let Erika Gerth (erikagerth329@gmail.com) know that you would like to receive your flu shot on October 15th and she will provide the appropriate form for you to complete in advance of the event. You don't have to be a STARS regular, or even a senior, to take advantage of this opportunity!

**Mobile Food Pantry:** The September 9th mobile food pantry truck was in Russellville at Trintiy Lutheran Church parking lot. We served 115 families with 316 people in their families. Items given out were apples, apple juice, frozen chicken patties, canned corn and green beans, ice cream, assorted frozen meats, milk, Pedialyte, radishes, tortilla chips, and fresh assorted vegetables. The Trinity LYO and God's Kids collected assorted groceries of 130 items to share at the pantry. Volunteers from the Lohman Lions Club were Alberta and Gary Zumwalt, from St. Paul's Lutheran was Gary and Audrey Bunch. Next mobile food pantry truck will be October 14 th at 1:00 pm.

# WELCA Mid-Mo Fall Gathering-September 27, 2025: Erika Gerth



On a bright and sunny day in late September, women from ten ELCA churches in Central Missouri traveled to St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Lohman for the Mid-Mo Fall Gathering. Hugs and and warm folks areetinas abounded as enjoyed a light breakfast, prepared by the women of St. Paul's, prior to the beginning of the meeting. Donita Stubinger, president of St. Paul's WELCA, extended a warm welcome to the group of forty (40) attendees. Opening devotions, led

by Lois Viebrock of Cole Camp, set the tone for the morning with the reading of a poem focused on the importance of grace. Singing is an important component of these events. Jennifer Plochberger,







accompanied by Kathy Meller, selected hymns which focused on the theme of today's gathering: "Vessels of God's Grace."

Pastor David Viles led the group in a study of the day's focus verse, Ephesians 2:8, which reads "For by grace you have been saved by faith, and this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God." Grace can be thought of as the steady hand of God which holds us when our own faith falters. Thanks be to God!

Carolyn Bauer, Trinity Lutheran, Pyrmont, led the business meeting of the day. She reviewed the organizational structure of our Synod and brought to our attention the Women of the ELCA's Triennial Gathering, which will take place in Des Moines, Iowa, July 16-19, 2026. Several women have already made room reservations and encouraged others to do the same! A "gathering," such as today's event, will be hosted by Trinity, Russellville on April 25, 2026. A shorter drive for sure! An offering of \$1,671.00 was collected, to be divided between the Synod, a couple of scholarship funds, as well as RACS. (Rape, Abuse, Crisis Services)

Following a delicious lunch prepared and served by Misty Schroeder and the women of St. Paul's, the group returned to the sanctuary for the introduction of Tyler Rieke, Executive Director of RACS. She provided us with an overview of the organization which was established in Jefferson City in 1980 to serve individuals who have experienced domestic violence. We learned that RACS maintains a 24 hour hotline and makes available a safe place in an undisclosed location for victims as they determine next steps. Individuals receive counseling, court advocacy, and if needed, child care. We were shocked to learn over half of women, and 1 in 3 men, have experienced sexual violence involving physical contact

during their lifetime. RACS's service area consists of 9 counties, a large area for only 22 trained individuals to cover!

We thank Tyler for sharing information about the many ways RACS serves the needs of individuals dealing with domestic violence. From the hot line to a safe haven, victims can begin to heal and make new beginnings. It is our prayer that the numerous in-kind gifts of paper towels, shampoo, and other personal care items which filled her SUV upon her departure will be beneficial to those in the shelter. And we trust that the monetary gift of \$622.00 from the day's offering, will further the work of this important agency.
